BOOTLEG WHISKEY ALWAYS DANGEROUS

DEATH AND BLINDNESS

Both Possible Results from Use of Moonshine, all of Which Contains Elements of Alcohol Poison

The general public should be impressed with the dangers involved in the drinking of bootleg whiskey. The number of deaths from this source and their alarming increase has prompted J. M. Doran, head of the Industrial Alcohol and Chemical division of the Prohibition unit to issue a statement which Commissioner Haynes hopes will fall under the eye of every man and woman in the United States and more particularly come to the attention of men and women who are following the habit of drinking homemade whiskey.

After pointing out that it is impossible for the novice to detect the presence of wood alcohol in illicitly concocted whiskey, Mr. Doran says: "Wood alcohol produces intoxication rapidly and in addition most seriously affects the optic nerve, resulting in paralysis and atrophy; with consequent total blindness, which, so far as is known, is incurable."

Produces Blindness

Mr. Doran further says that opinions differ as to whether or not absolutely pure wood alcohol will produce blindness, but says that the opinion is practically unanimous that the commercial grade ordinarily obtained will produce blindness. He points out that there are two grades of denatured alcohol. The first is known as completely denatured alcohol which has been prepared according to a limited number of fixed formulae for sale to the general public without permits and the second class, known as specially denatured alcohol, is prepared by the use of a great many specific denaturants. The latter quality can be obtained only under a heavy bond for use in manufacturing purposes.

Extremely Poisonous

"It will be seen," says Mr. Doran in his report, "that much of the whiskey and kindred drinks peddled by bootleggers contain one or more of the three classes of alcohol, all of which are absolutely dangerous and some extremely poisonous. Bootleggers often attempt to redistill, rectify and recover some of the classes of denatured alcohol but it is a foregone conclusion that they are never able to eliminate their poisonous character entirely. It is impossible to remove

wood alcohol from any other alcoholic mixture by distilling, precipitating or any other manipulative process which the bootleggers employ.

Cause of Deaths

"The majority of deaths and cases of serious illness throughout the country from drinking bootleg whiskey may unquestionably be ascribed to the use of these alcohols." The chemist further adds that "a word of caution should be sounded against the use of any quick test for the purpose of determining the presence or absence of wood alcohol, such as the addition of powders or vials of liquid. It is impossible to detect wood alcohol except through chemical analysis and that performed by a skilled chemist in a well equipped laboratory. It is a well known fact among chemists that wood alcohol is one of the most difficult substances to detect in any liquid."

VOLIVA PLANNING STEEL SIGNBOARDS

CHARGED ELECTRICALLY

Says Any Who Meddle With the Boards May Be Electro-cuted; Proclamation Issued

"The fellow that starts out to lick me has got to get up early in the morning," said Voliva, as he revealed some of his plans to 3,000 persons at Shiloh Tabernacle, on Sunday. "I'm going to erect large steel bulletin boards, with iron posts, so that it will be impossible to destroy them. The boards will be charged with electricity so that if anybody tries to deface them they will be instantly electrocuted."

Issues Proclamation

In a proclamation issued Saturday by Voliva and which was scattered all over the City of Zion from a bombing plane, the overseer made it plain that he intends to run all out of town who do not belong to his creed. Over his name he printed the following:

As a multitude, we shall declare that other than Zion families are not allowed to live here, and that outside factories are not wanted and not permitted!

No outside institutions have any business here, and Zion people do not want them!

Cites Agreements

The thousands of leasees who purchased land here agreed with the lessor that the premises obtained, "each and every part and portion thereof, and all buildings, improvements, or anything else that may ever be upon said premises, shall never be used for a dance hall; or the office or residence of a practicing physician, surgeon, or other person actually engaged in the practice of medicine or surgery."
