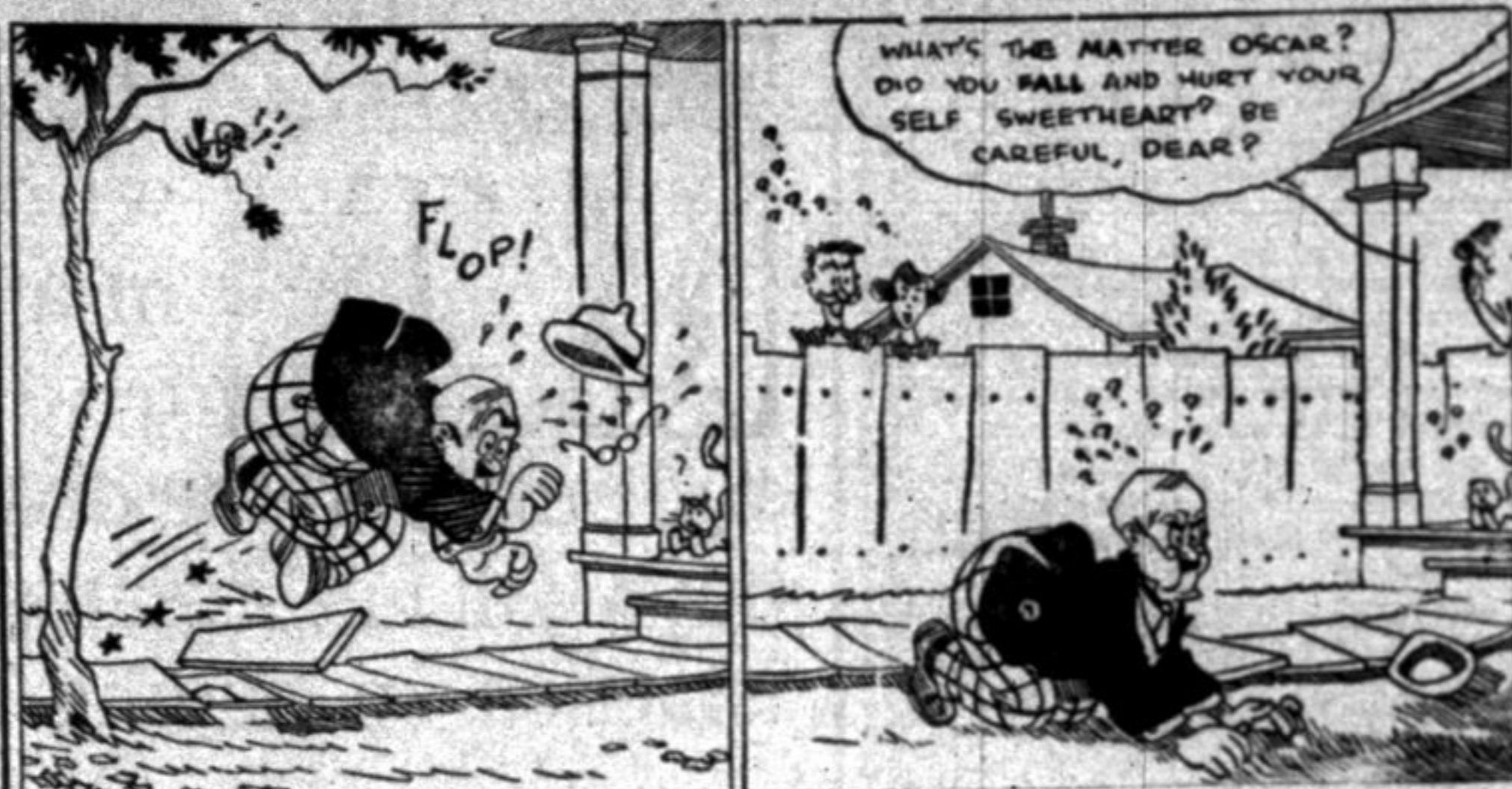

DEERFIELD CRUSHES RIVERSIDE, 51 TO 0

LOCAL OFFENSIVE STRONG

Riverside Makes Only One First Down; Great Crowd Despite Heavy Rain; Play Next at Proviso

Despite a drizzling rain, a great crowd saw Deerfield crush Riverside 51 to 0 in the first game of the season's suburban league schedule to be played here. The one-sided score was not an indication of the quality of football played, as the contest was a good one throughout and held the crowd to the end although rain fell heavily at times. Long gains were made several times by Harvey, Deerfield's star half-back; Steele turned a similar trick through tackle again and again, and Watt and Allen through the middle. Sholtz ran two punts back, one 35 and the other, 40 yards. Captain Sandwick played throughout at left end and right tackle, but there were numerous changes in other positions, as second team men were substituted after the "heavies" had tested the quality of the Riverside invasion. The locals especially showed good defensive work.

**First Quarter**  
In the first quarter Riverside kicked off to Sandwick on the 30-yard line. Watt made the first down, and Harvey went through tackle for 10 yards. Watt makes first down on 15-yard line; Deerfield gains to five-yard line and Steele goes over for touchdown, but the kick for point was blocked. Riverside kicked to Watt on 40-yard line. Spellman punts; Watt recovers but is penalized. Score 6 to 0 at end of quarter.

**Second Quarter**  
Starting the second quarter Harvey went through for 15 yards. Ball on five-yard line; Steele makes touchdown and kicks goals. Watt and Harvey make first downs in next play. Riverside's ball at 30-yard line. They punt into the air. Watt takes ball to 25 yard line, and Steele makes long run off tackle for touchdown. Fall to get extra point when kick is blocked. Riverside kicks to Allen; Watt fumbles and recovers. Half ends 19 to 0.

HIGHWOOD HEAVIES TRIM MOFFETTS

DEFEAT VISITORS SUNDAY

Take Game from Fast Chicago 11 on Local Field, 20-0; Good Showing Made by Players

Final Frame

Beginning the last quarter Dyer makes touchdown, but kick is blocked. After considerable back and forward play Steele goes through 10 yards, and Harvey scores and Steele passes to Harvey for extra punt. In the last minute Deerfield fumbled on five-yard line; Spellman recovers for a touchdown and Steele kicks goal as whistle blows. Score 51 to 0.

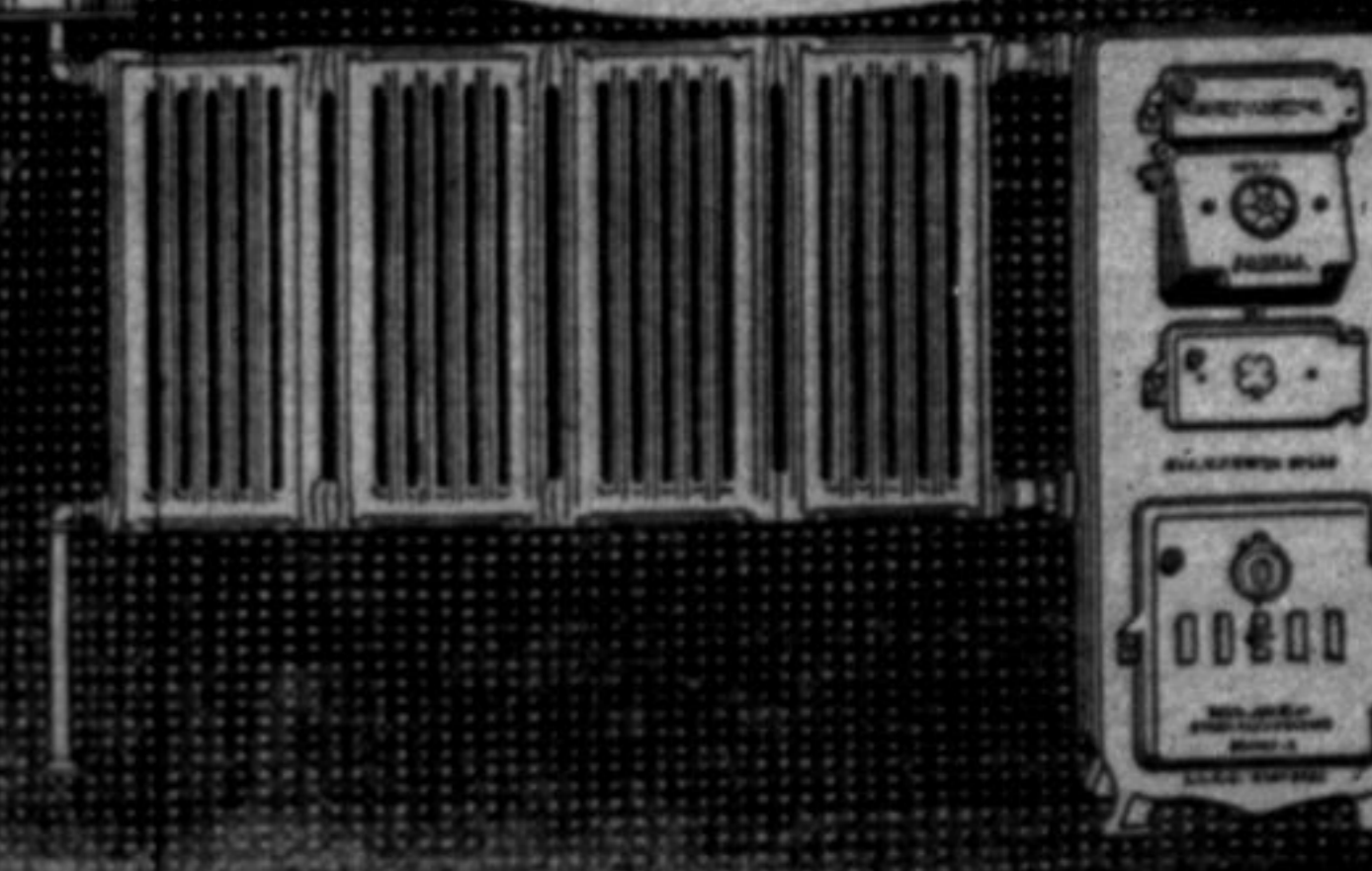
