MISS MOLLY WILSON PASSED AWAY MON.
Funeral Services Were Private; Interment in Graceland Yesterday

News of the death of Miss Molly Byerly Wilson on Monday evening at the Mgraine hotel came as a shock and surprise to her many warm friends in Highland Park to whom she was endeared, not only by the charm of her personality but by her ready sympathy and whole-hearted giving of her musical talents whenever opportunity offered to render a service.

A native of Los Angeles, she spent seven years in Germany in the study of music and voice culture, and upon her return to America toured the United States and Canada in concert. Her earnest effort and zeal for achievement which characterized her career must always be an inspiration to those who had the privilege of her friendship.

Her place of residence for the last few years has been in Chicago where she had a studio. She came frequently to Highland Park as the guest of her friend Dr. Roberts Lee Moore, and many are the times she has added to the pleasure of church, club and private entertainments with her musical gifts and went regularly to Great Lakes to entertain the boys. She was on the program for the opening meeting of the Highland Park Woman's club on October 17th, but was unable to fulfill her engagement on account of illness. She improved so much however, that her friends thought her on the road to recovery, when a turn for the worse came from which she could not rally and all must regret her untimely death.

Funeral services were private and interment was at Graceland on Wednesday morning.

Molly Byerly Wilson was a splendid, lovable woman filling a useful place in a busy world and her spirit was as strong and courageous as her heart was tender and sweet. She had no ill word for any human soul and delighted always in giving praise to others. She leaves the memory of a bright and cheerful spirit and by all who knew her it will be kept as the California skies she loved so well. "To live in hearts we leave behind is not to die."
