COUNTY RECORDS ARE UNPROTECTED

NO ROOM IN COURT HOUSE

Thousands of Dollars' Worth of Instruments Stored in the Attic; New Addition Badly Needed

A disastrous fire in the Lake county courthouse would mean a calamity and result in the loss of from \$40,000,000 to \$100,000,000 worth of records. This startling situation is clear to anyone who has explored the county building where truck loads of records lie exposed to fire in the attic of the building, because of the crowded condition of the vaults. This appalling condition, and one which would mean the loss of thousands of dollars to every property owner in the county, has prevailed for several years and shows the urgent need for an addition to the court house, such as it is proposed to build, provided the \$300,000 bond issue carries at the Nov. 7 election.

Thousands of Property Records
 A visit to the office of the recorder of deeds shows how many of the records are unprotected. Lewis O. Brockway, during his 20 years in office as recorder, has recorded 142,000 deeds and mortgages, and prior to that time there had been filed about 75,000 instruments.

Asked as to the value of these records, Mr. Brockway said: "It is impossible to tell what they are worth in cash, but if they were destroyed it would cost from \$200 to \$500 ordinarily to establish title through the courts to each piece of property they represent. This would mean a cost of from \$40,000,000 to \$100,000,000."

"The abstractors have abbreviated records", Mr. Brockway added. "After the Chicago fire there was only one abstractor who had an abbreviated record of all the property there and he put up the price to a prohibitive cost. In some instances these abbreviated records were accepted as title."

In addition there are also tax books in the county treasurer's department that are exposed to fire hazard.

The reason the supervisors decided in favor of the addition were the statements of all the architects that the present structure is in too good a condition to raze, it being as good as a new building. The \$300,000 addition will provide room sufficient to meet the needs of the county for 20 or 30 years.
