ORCHESTRA SERIES OPENS NOVEMBER 20

LITTLE SYMPHONY COMES

Noted Orchestra Under Direction of Geo. Dasch, Conductor of High Repute; 2 More Concerts

The first of a series of three concerts to be given this winter under the auspices of the Deerfield-Shields Orchestral association will take place Monday evening, Nov. 20, in the high school building and the feature attraction will be the Little Symphony orchestra of Chicago, Dasch, conductor. An afternoon concert for students of the schools will be given at 4 o'clock. Adults accompanying children will be admitted.

Since the ever-increasing activities of the Chicago Symphony orchestra within the limits of the city of Chicago have necessitated the cancellation of practically all outside engagements and because the cost of presenting a complete symphony orchestra in smaller communities is almost prohibitive, conductor Dasch conceived the idea of supplying the smaller communities' demand for the best orchestral music with an ensemble of twenty-five musicians. The Little Symphony of Chicago was accordingly launched last season by Mr. Dasch and his artist-colleagues, and has already given many successful concerts under the baton of its gifted conductor.

The second concert will be held Dec. 17, at 3:15 in the afternoon, and the Chicago Business Men's orchestra will furnish the music.

The third concert will be given Feb. 16, in the evening, with the Northwestern University Symphony orchestra as the attraction.

Effort is being made to sell 500 season tickets for the course to finance the entire proposition.
