### COUNTY ASSESSED VALUE, \$39,000,000

#### LIST 5373 AUTOMOBILES

Total Valuation Increased More Than \$470,000 Since Last Year; Lands And Lots Value

The total assessed valuation of real and personal property in Lake county is \$39,099,995, according to the records of the board of review, which completed its work and adjourned Friday of last week. The total is \$470,855 more than last year's assessment.

The total assessed value of all the real estate in the county is \$2,813,940 and the personal property \$10,186,055, 5,373 Automobiles

There are 5,373 automobiles in the county, assessed value being \$570,000. There are 774 more automobiles than there were a year ago.

There are 7,878 horses, valued at \$272,490; 25,314 head of cattle, valued at \$438,520; mules, 124, value \$3,985; sheep, 1,591, value \$4,100; hogs, 6,546, value \$33,410.

Of billiard and pool tables there are 209, valued at \$15,265.

Watches and clocks total 1,659, value \$10,505.

The total value of merchandise is \$671,250, material and manufactured articles \$327,730; farm implements \$221,700; gold and silver plate \$15,795; diamonds \$27,150.

Money in banks by individuals \$1,248,555.

Household and office furniture \$801,750.

#### Land Value

The total value of all lands in the county as fixed by the board is \$10,620,790. There are 198,178 acres of improved land, the assessed value being \$8,452,425. There are 67,865 acres of unimproved land, assessed value being \$2,133,905. The railroad lands, consisting of 341 acres, are valued at \$68,920.

The total value of all the lots in the county is \$18,293,150.

#### In Deerfield and Shields

In Waukegan township the total value of lots is \$555,840, while that in the city is \$5,269,265. That in Zion City is \$924,360; in Shields \$1,042,590 and Lake Forest \$3,578,300. In Libertyville 446,240. Deerfield \$918,255; Highland Park \$3,625,925.

The improvements on all the lands in the county total \$3,409,475.

The chairman of the board was Martin Ringdahl, and the other members were M. R. Miller, Richard S. Barnum. The clerk was Miss Marian Persons. Those who assisted in the clerical work were Miss Florence Efinger and Mrs. Melvin Pitts.

##### NEIGHBORHOOD JOTTINGS

County Seat Doings and Other Happenings Here and There About County in Condensed Form

Waukegan coal dealers report that hard coal price this winter will be about \$16.15 per ton, no higher than last year.

George B. Stephens, former supervisor from Newport township, died last week at his home near Milburn.

Report that war camps at the Great Lakes naval station have been sold to a wrecking company for \$250,000 is a great disappointment to the organizations which have been urging rehabilitation of the station.

Measles, diphtheria and scarlet fever are reported in Waukegan.

Capt. Waldo Evans and Commander J. H. Ingram of Great Lakes station have returned from a two weeks tour of inspection in western states.

Miss Mary Polmeteer has been re-appointed county probation officer by County Judge P. L. Persons, in accordance with the approval of the county board. Last spring Miss Polmeteer's salary was reduced by the board and she handed in her resignation, which later was withdrawn when the board agreed to restore her salary to its former amount.

Instead of costing approximately \$15,000,000 as originally estimated, it was stated Saturday, at Waukegan, on apparently reliable authority that the mammoth Johns-Manville plant on the north flats at that city will cost \$30,000,000 and will make it one of the biggest, if not the biggest, plant owned by this immense corporation.

"Health Week" program held last week in the various parts of the county under direction of the Lake County Dental Society, the state health department and county superintendent of school, proved very popular and the meetings were largely attended.
