of North 1/2, N. W. 1/4, S. W. 1/4, Section 31, Fractional Township 43 North, Range 13, East of the 3d P. M., then North 8'-45" East on the Westerly line of Sheridan Road as now laid out 216.5 feet; thence North 48°-02' West 43.7 feet; thence South 0°-05' West 243.2 feet to the point of beginning, the last course being the West line of Sheridan Road South of the point of beginning extended North-erly.

Also, that part of the North 1/2 of the N. W. 1/4 of the S. W. 1/4 of Section 31, Fractional Township 43 North, Range 13, East of the 3d P. M., described as follows: Beginning at a point on the Westerly line of Sheridan Road as now laid out 216.5 feet North of the intersection of said line with the South line of North 1/2, Northwest 1/4, Southwest 1/4, Section 31, Fractional T. 43 North, Range 13, East of the 3d P. Notice is hereby given to the voters of the City of Highland Park that a special election will be held in and for said city on Saturday the 18th day of November, A. D., 1922, for the purpose of submitting to the voters, the question of the annexation to the City of Highland Park, the territory described as follows: The East Half (E 1/2) of the Southeast Quarter (SE 1/4) of Section Twenty-two (22), Township Forty-three (43) North, Range Twelve (12) East of the Third (3rd) Principal Meridian, except that part thereof lying South of the center of the Public Road known as Central Avenue.

Each of the election precincts of said City to be and it is hereby declared and created an election district or precinct; that the voting places in and

for each of said precincts shall be as follows:
First Precinct—City Hall, 549 Central Avenue.
Second Precinct—Methodist Church, Cor. North Avenue & Lauretta Place.

Fourth Precinct—Fred Lindholm's Residence, 1453 Judson Avenue.

The polls of said election will be opened at 7:00 o'clock in the morning and will continue open until 5:00 o'clock in the evening of Saturday, November 18th, 1922.
