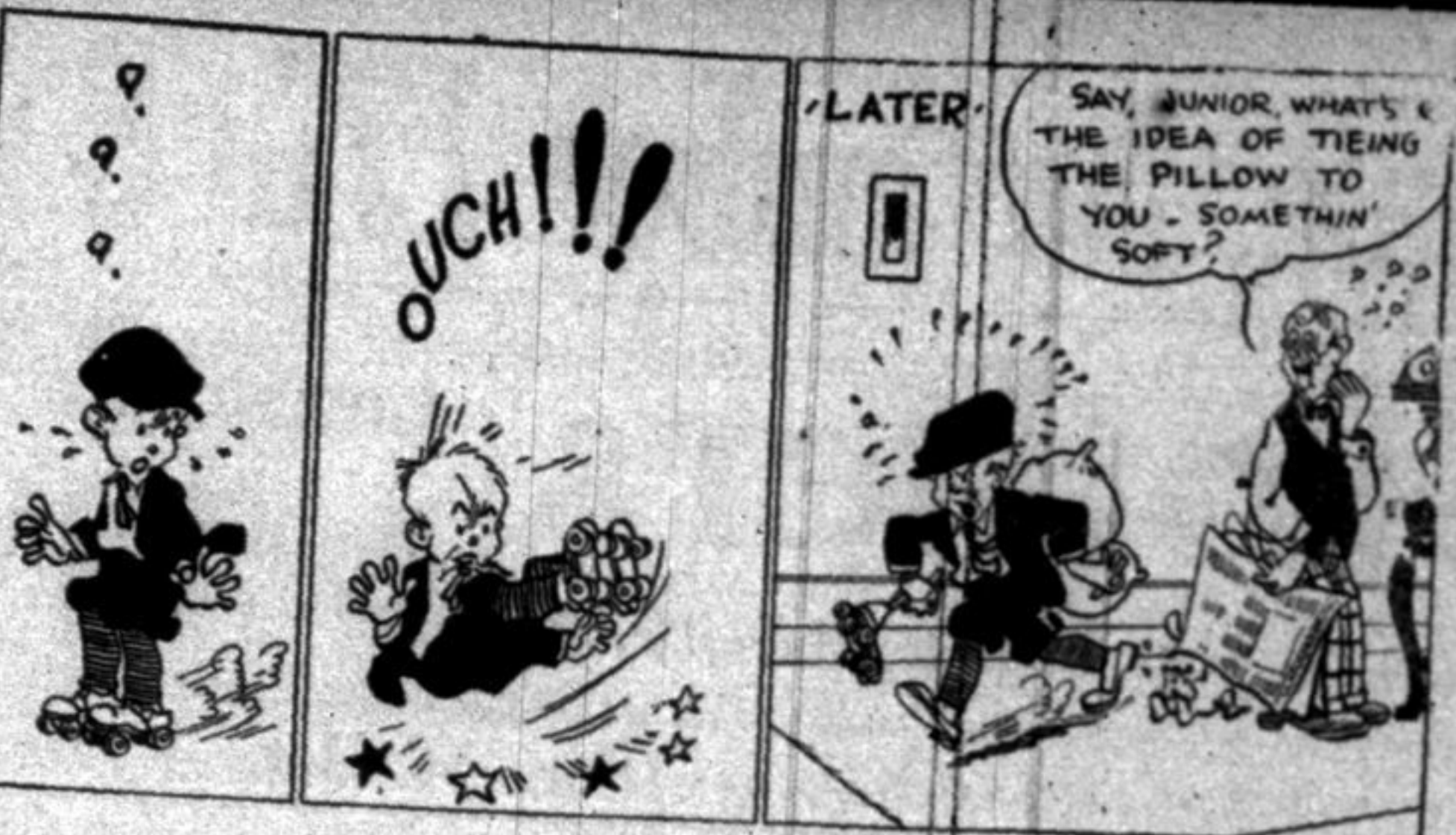

DEERFIELD LOSES GAME TO EVANSTON

SCORE ONE-SIDED—27 TO 7
Evanston Gets Breaks and Wins By Smashing Tactics; Watt Stars for Home Team; Oak Park Next

With Evanston getting the breaks and Deerfield's defense lacking its usual stiffness, the home team beat the Deerfield-Shields high school football team, 25 to 7, Saturday on the Evanston field.

Ted Watt of Deerfield did stellar work in plunges and defense, and H. Watt, Sandwick and Reichelt bore the brunt of the heavy attacks of the Evanston gridders. Adams and Ritchie featured for Evanston. Twice Deerfield's passes were intercepted and once Adams ran 75 yards for a touchdown.

Watt Scores
Deerfield made its touchdown when Watt caught a long forward pass and plunged across on the next play.

Evanston now stands even with Oak Park as the head of the suburban-league, having played five games, lost none and tied one.

Deerfield plays Oak Park next and a hard game is in prospect, Oak Park defeated Proviso last Saturday in a stiff contest, 13 to 12.

L. F. ACADEMY PLAYS CULVER ON SATURDAY

ANNUAL HOME COMING

Most Important Athletic Event of the Year for Both and Culver Bringing Big Crowd of Fans

Lake Forest Academy will hold its Homecoming on Saturday, with the Culver game as the main attraction. This game is traditionally the most important athletic event in the eyes of both schools. The rivalry is intense and the spirit will find expression in a hard fought battle.

Lake Forest has defeated Culver for the past two years, last year the score being 34-7. They will attempt to equal the record once established by Culver of three straight victories. The Fort Sheridan band will be stationed on the Lake Forest side of the field. Daylight fireworks will add to the noise and enthusiasm.

All Culver Coming
The entire student body of Culver will attend the game. The 700 hundred cadets in uniforms, together with their band, will make a strong rooting section for Culver. The fact that Culver will attend the game in a body is indicative of the importance they attach to the game, as this is the first time they have adjourned school for an athletic contest.

The Lake Forest hopes are not as high as they were two weeks ago, due to several disastrous injuries, but Coach Jones is drilling his men in every way and will have a strong team. Lake Forest has lost but one prep school game in three years.

Is Undefeated
Culver has run up large scores on all the teams that they have met this year, and has not been defeated. They started the season with twelve letter men on the squad and they seem to be very strong on offense. Coach Beck is determined to wipe out the defeats of the past two years and will have his men going at top speed on Saturday.

The game will be played on Farwell Field and will start at 2:30. It will be an opportunity to see two of the strongest Academy teams in the country, and also an opportunity to see some future college stars in action.

Former L. F. Players
Kopt, who played for the Academy several years ago is now a valuable man on the great Washington and Jefferson team. Pagenkopf, who was the quarterback at the Academy two years ago, was rated by all the eastern writers as the best man Princeton had, but has been kept out of the game by injuries. Bergen is also a quarter for Princeton. McClintock is playing on the University of Alabama team.
