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OFFICIAL CANVASS OF LAKE CO. VOTE

SHERIFF LED CO. TICKET
 Chindblom High Man on State Ticket; 504 Socialist Votes Cast in County; 234 Farm-Labor

Official canvass of last Tuesday's vote in Lake county by Lew A. Hendee, county clerk, and his corps of efficient aids, including Justice Harry Hoyt, Justice Robert E. Pearsall, Miss Florence Efinger and Mrs. Melvin Pitts, shows that Edwin Ahlstrom sheriff-elect led the county ticket with a total of 10,357, Hendee second with 10,169, William F. Weiss leading the eighth district with 15,341 and Carl R. Chindblom leading the state ticket with 9,603.

A total of 504 Socialists and 234 Farmer-Labor party supporters voted in the entire county.
