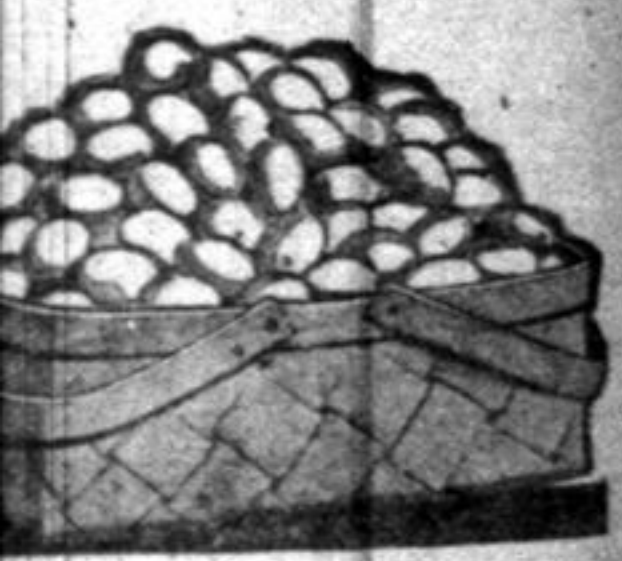

### DEERFIELD LOSES TO OAK PARKERS

#### LATTER TIE FOR THE TITLE

##### Hard-Fought Game Results in Victory for Leaders Who With Evanston Head The League

At no stage of the contest, which was hard fought throughout, was Oak Park able to gain through the Deerfield line. The field was muddy and the battle largely resolved itself into a punting duel between Mike Dyer and Drechsler of Oak Park, with the honors evenly divided.

All who saw the game declare it was one of the best football games ever played in the suburban league and the magnificent work of the Deerfield-Shields gridders gets full measure of praise everywhere. They played the game of their lives and the school is proud of them.
