SOLVES PROBLEMS OF FORMER STYLES

FURNITURE AND COSTUMES

Ryerson Library at Art Institute Describes How These Were Made in Olden Times

Supposing you got into an argument with a friend about how homes were furnished two or three hundred years ago, or what costumes people wore, or what was the prevailing style of architecture during a certain period at any time in the past four thousand years! You can find the answer to all these questions in the Ryerson Library, Art Institute of Chicago.

The three thousand students there in the art school make constant use of the library to study their problems. If the class in interior decorating is told to decorate a room in Dutch style of the sixteenth or seventeenth centuries, they seek books on the famous genre painters of that period, and there they find color-reproductions of paintings showing domestic scenes and interiors.

Commercial art establishments send their artists to the Ryerson Library for models or illustrations showing drawings of gargoyles, finials, capitals, pilasters, masterpieces in architecture, sculptural decorations from the earliest period down to the present, and for portraits of the great men and women of the world.

A short time ago an engraving firm wished to reproduce the likeness of William Penn. It found the print of a portrait of Penn in a book at the library, had the print photographed and from the photograph made a half-tone. Designers of garments and costumes will find there a rich field for study, for thousands of illustrations of costumes, many in full color, are to be found in various works on this subject. Students of design will find numberless illustrations of textile patterns, jewelry, silverware, embroidery, laces, basketry, wall paper, borders, conventionalized floral motifs. In fact, the decorative art of the various nations of the world may be found there.

The Ryerson Library of Art and the Burnham Library of Architecture are free to the public on Wednesdays, Saturdays, and Sundays (afternoon) and free to visitors of the museum on all days of the week.

SILVER DOLLARS NOW SELDOM SEEN

Little Used in Business as Currency Gains Favor; Gold Also

In a shoeshop not long since we saw a man plank down silver in payment of his purchase. The procedure was so unusual that the clerk was surprised, and gazed for a moment in doubt at the round, staring dollars. The explanation, of course, was not far to seek; the man hailed from a section where "hard" money is still in favor.

But the incident set up a train of reflection on the steps whereby mankind has progressed from the barter of goods for goods to the exchange of goods for gold, a commodity found universally acceptable—or for some equivalent. How rarely do we see gold now on a counter! He who does not pay with an order on his bank, pays almost invariably with paper currency. Specie, except for pocket change, is obsolescent.

And how enormously trade was expanded when it was discovered that gold could be economized thus! If we try to think of doing the world's business nowadays by the use of metal the mind falters. And so we come to the comfortable reflection that, although the use of paper tokens as a medium of exchange may bring ruin and misery, as the plight of Russia and Germany so amply testifies, its use within scientific boundaries has been a potent factor in the immense and interlocking interchange of ivory, apes and peacocks for wheat and gas ranges and shoes.

Here is one of those romances of commerce which is so much a matter of everyday that we take it altogether as a matter of course. Some day a man of imagination will write for us a picture story of what the manufacture of paper money has meant to the modern world.
