### BRUNDAGE MAY PASS ON STATE BONUS ACT

MANY MOOTED POINTS

Service Board Finding Numerous Questions Requiring Legal Decision; Language of The Measure

Many questions are arising on the construction of the Illinois soldier bonus law voted on at the November 7, election. The service recognition board, comprising Governor Small, State Treasurer Miller and Adjutant General Black, has discovered a number of mooted points which, members of the board declared may eventually be placed before the attorney general for decision.

#### Limit of Application

One of the questions is whether the bonus law applies to service after the signing of the armistice, Nov. 11, 1918. The law on this point says: "Every person who served honorably in active duty in the military or naval service of the United States at any time between the sixth day of April, 1917 and the eleventh day of November, 1918, shall be entitled to receive from the soldier's compensation fund of the state treasury, compensation of 50 cents for each day that such person was in active service after April 6, 1917, but not exceeding a total of three hundred dollars (\$300)."

#### Language of Act

Thus the language of the act in defining the qualification entitling a person to the bonus is "service" between the sixth day of April, 1917, and the eleventh day of November 1918, and its language in providing payment is "compensation" . . . for each day in active service after April 6, 1917."

Adjutant General Black pointed out that while the law specifies a maximum bonus of \$300, no one could collect that much if paid only for the period between April 6, 1917 and Nov. 11, 1918. There are exactly 584 days between the two dates, and the amount collectable at 50 cents a day for the entire period by a person who was already in active service when war was declared would be \$292.

#### In Training Camp

Another question is whether the bonus applies to those who were in officers' training camps. Some newspapers have announced that it does not, but Adjutant General Black said he believed them to be in error.

The law provides that no payment shall be made "for time spent while taking training in any students' army or navy training corps." It is generally believed does not apply to officers' training camps.

Other questions relating to residence and the meaning of "active service" and of "discharge from service" are to be settled by the service recognition board.

### TELLS OF PROHIB MEET AT TORONTO

Lake County Resident Writes of World Convention Which He Attended

The following interesting letter dated Nov. 29, has been received from Thomas R. Quayle telling of the world's Prohibition convention at Toronto, Canada, which he attended.

I thought possibly you might be pleased to receive a brief communication from the World's Prohibition Convention. It is a huge success. The flags of 40 different nations adorn the walls and at the international banquet 56 nationalities responded. I have met delegates and talked with them from India, China, Japan, Africa, Poland, Russia, Yukon Canada, Alaska, Sweden, Iceland, from the hottest countries on the earth as well as the coldest. One lady informed me that she had travelled eight weeks to get to the convention.

We heard students from the Balkan states and a Canadian Prime Minister, also a Canadian secretary of state; we heard scholars, and authors, and splendid orations.

Perhaps more interesting than all would be the fact that Lake county, Illinois was mentioned several times by different speakers from the U. S. as a place that had distinguished itself for law enforcement in America. What an honest, intelligent, prosecuting attorney-general could do when backed by his fellow citizens was set forth as an example to the delegates from all parts of the world. It was during the debate upon the question, "How can we get officials to enforce the laws?" that Lake county came into the limelight.
