The shop was an outgrowth of war work done by a committee organized for the purpose of assisting the permanent blind war relief fund, and started with the idea of furnishing funds with which to make regular contributions to organized charities. Through the efforts of this committee, and additional members who were brought in to form a committee of sixty, thousands of dollars have been contributed to organized charities in Highland Park and vicinity. The shop celebrated the third birthday last June and during its entire existence all the clerks have been volunteer workers. This means constant service on the part of the members of the committee of sixty.

There are two departments, the Thrift department, which is dependent upon donations of clothing, household goods, etc., and the Handiwork department which is operated along

the lines of a woman's exchange, and as these profits are so small, the shop has bought considerable sums also have been contributed to the following organizations:

Highland Park Community Center, Highland Park Y. W. C. A., Highland Park Hospital, Arden Shore, Service League for the Hindicappel (Chicago), Dorcas Home, Patriotic League of Highwood, Permanent Blind War Fund for a Hut in France for a Blinded Soldier and his family, special gift to the P. B. W. F., Highland Park Visiting Nurses association, Highland Park Young Men's club, Lake Bluff Orphanage, the Chicago Shut Ins. These will continue to get contributions as long as the shop exists.

BASIC INDUSTRIES IN PAYROLL BOOST

Marked Increases in Several Staple Lines Reported Over Last Year

The United States bureau of labor statistics shows that for the month of October, 34 of the 43 leading basic industries in the United States showed an increase in the total amount of payrolls as compared with the previous month. The largest increases were in the following industries: railroad car building and repairing, flour milling, glass, hosiery and knit goods, iron and steel, pianos. The decreases were slight with the exception of seasonal industries like the manufacture of fertilizer, and the pottery industry, which has been seriously affected by a general strike.

The data issued compares October this year with October last year, showing that the iron and steel payrolls increased 65 per cent during the year, automobiles 41 per cent, leather goods 21 per cent, car building and repairing 19 per cent and several other basic industries a smaller per cent.
