### TREASURY NOTES FOR WAR STAMPS

War Saving Stamps of 1918 Ser-  
 ies Can Be Exchanged  
 After January 1

During the war the government of-  
 fered war savings stamps, paying  
 about four per cent as a method of  
 saving for people of small means.  
 Since the war, and to take the place  
 of war savings certificates in denomi-  
 nations of \$25, \$100, and \$1,000, now  
 sold to investors at \$20.50, \$82 and  
 \$820, respectively.

They pay four per cent if held un-  
 til maturity, five years from the date  
 of issue. About \$625,000,000 of War  
 Savings Stamps, series of 1918, be-  
 come due January 1, 1923, and the  
 government now offers to issue treas-  
 ury savings certificates in exchange  
 for them, affording to owners an op-  
 portunity to continue a safe invest-  
 ment with good interest.

Savings has furnished the life blood  
 for many nations and insures prop-  
 erty to the people. The government  
 is doing everything possible to en-  
 courage saving in the United States  
 by offering sound and attractive se-  
 curities for the investment of small  
 sums. If you want to save, and in-
