STATE TAX RATE UNCHANGED

Synchronizing with the action, made public recently, of the Illinois State Tax Commission in finding final results of assessments and equalization for the year 1922, comes the announcement from the office of Governor Len Small, following a meeting of the tax finding body created by statute, that the tax rate for the year would remain the same, aggregating four and five-tenths mills on each dollar, or about forty-five cents on each \$100 valuation of taxable property. The board is composed of Governor Small, State Auditor Andrew Russel and State Treasurer Edward E. Miller.

In fixing values for 1922 the tax commission made a decrease of \$127,801,568 on farm land valuation and \$97,473,340 in personal property. Increases were placed against lots, railroad and electric lines and capital stock, aggregating a total of \$24,701,556, and yet the decrease in sum total amounts to \$200,573,352 net as against the 1921 figures.
