COSTS \$61.15 YEAR TO EDUCATE CHILD

Per Capita Rate in This State, According to Supt. Blair

It costs \$61.15 a year to educate one child in Illinois. This is the average cost for each pupil the state over, the figure including both high school and grade school pupils. The cost was computed from figures on current school expenses collected in the office of Francis G. Blair, state superintendent of public instruction. The cost per capita of students in high school is \$130.21 a year, the figures show. This does not include interest on bonds, but only current expenses.
