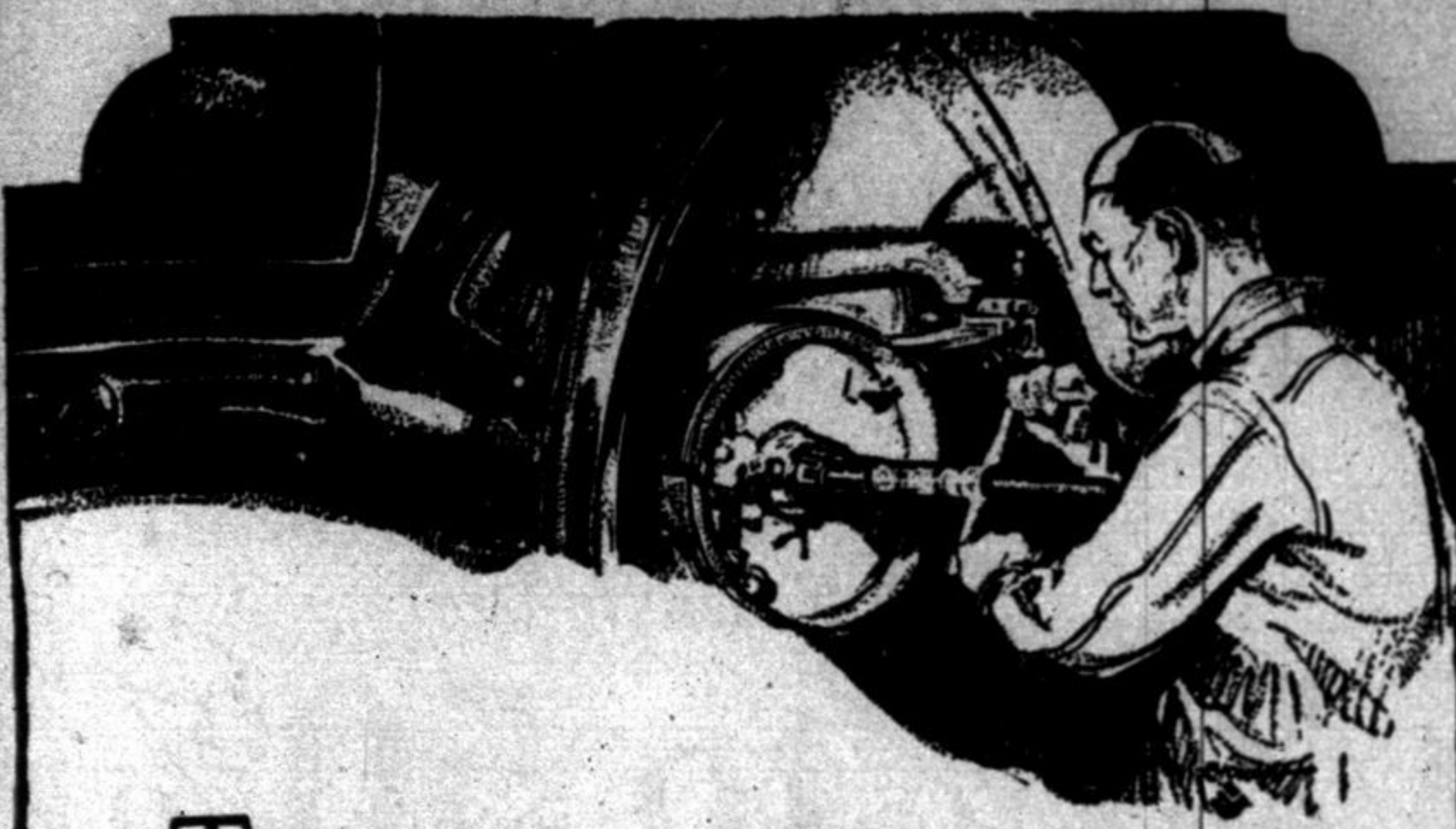

BRIEF NEWS ITEMS FROM LAKE COUNTY

NEIGHBORHOOD JOTTINGS

Interesting Events Happening in Various Sections of This County; News From County Seat

Frank Kendali, 89 years old, a resident of Waukegan since 1854, suffered a dislocated shoulder and a fracture of the right arm when he slipped on the ice.

Frank Lodesky, who would have been 78 years old had he lived until last Sunday, died last week at his home in Waukegan after an illness that has extended for more than two years.

He had been a resident of the county all his life, being born in Warren township January 14, 1845.

Shattuck and Layer, a well known firm of architects in Chicago who designed the original Y. M. C. A. building in Waukegan, several years ago, have been selected by the board of directors to design the \$60,000 addition which is to be built as soon as possible.

William Matthews, of Highwood, who escaped from the Elgin hospital for insane a number of times, was taken into custody last week at his home, Undersheriff T. J. Stahl taking him to Waukegan that afternoon.

As the result of a joy-ride last week, Policeman Walter Samuels, familiarly known as "Sambo" was discharged from the Waukegan department by Asst. Chief Thomas Tyrell. The assistant chief plans to prefer charges with the civil service commission.

Petition has been filed in probate court asking the issuance of letters of administration in the estate of Henry C. Burridge, well known Libertyville man, who conducted a greenhouse.

John Callahan, Waukegan dairyman who was recently found guilty of assault in connection with the death of Raymond G. Rigg, 13 years old, Wood River, Ill., is made defendant in a suit for \$10,000 as a result of the death. The praecipe was filed in the Circuit court.

Petition for letters of administration have been filed in probate court in the estate of William Pepper of Ela township, naming his widow and 13 children as the heirs. The petition asks the appointment of his widow, Mrs. Emma Pepper, as administrator. The estate consists of 200 acres of land, besides personal property valued at \$2,000.

JUDGE WELSH HOLDS COURT THIS WEEK

Judge Robert K. Welsh of Rockford opened court in Waukegan Monday. Six cases were placed on call which were to be tried before Judge Welsh.

These cases are:
McGowan vs. Cohen & Serlin.
Snyder vs. Corliss
Cooper vs. Morrow.
Touzalin Agency vs. Thomas Andrews Corp.
Village of Lake Zurich vs. Young Eggers vs. Yena.

Perhaps the most interesting of these suits is the Cooper vs. Morrow suit. This is the case in which James Morrow is sued for \$10,000 for death of Miss Mabel Cooper who died when the railing on a third floor apartment owned by Mr. Morrow gave way and the young woman fell to a cement sidewalk. The court took the case away from the jury and an appeal was taken. The appellate court reversed the judgement of the lower court which brings the case up for trial again.

The damage suit brought by a patient against Dr. Corliss, a Waukegan dentist, also should prove interesting, although an effort will be made to have this case go over to the March term.

The case of the Village of Lake Zurich vs. Young is an outgrowth of a violation of a new city ordinance.
