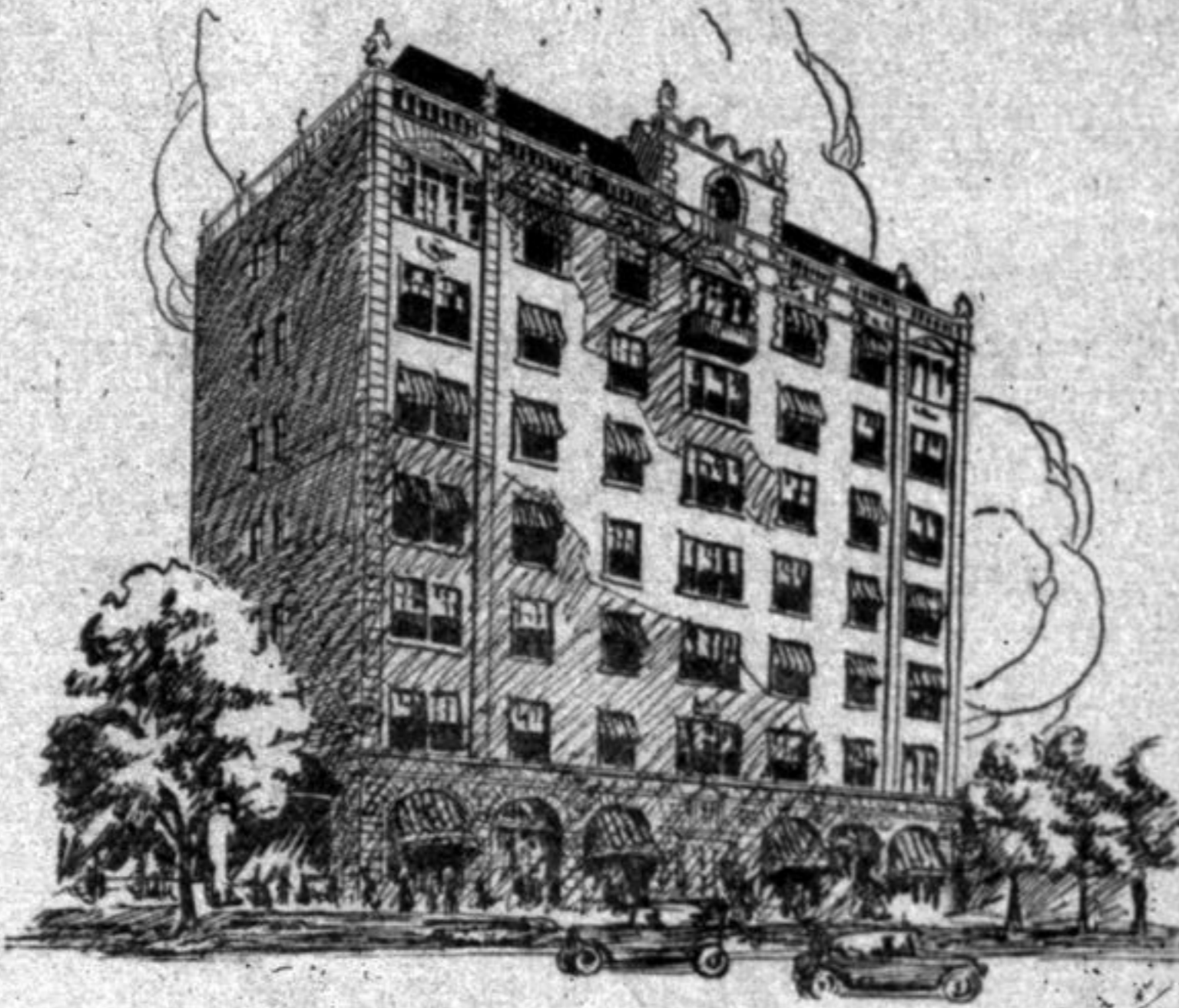

NEIGHBORHOOD JOTTINGS

Happenings Here and There in This Section; County Seat Doings; Court Cases General News

One of the most daring robberies in Waukegan in years took place last week when three armed bandits held up and robbed the Model Clothing house at 118 Washington street, escaping with about \$150 which they took from the cash register.

The dedication and opening of the Round Lake school took place last week. The main speech of the evening was made by T. Arthur Simpson, county superintendent of schools. The remodeling of the old school and the erection of a much-needed addition cost \$15,000.

Mrs. Katherine Carroll, 40, of 2248 Harvey avenue, North Chicago, died last week following an illness at the Lake county general hospital of two months from tuberculosis.

Definite plans as to how the Waukegan lodge of Elks is to finance its proposed \$250,000 home were announced for the first time last week at a big meeting in the armory at which a class of thirteen candidates was initiated.

Sam Serban of Ingleside last week pleaded guilty in the county court to a charge of having a punch board in his possession and was given the minimum sentence by Judge Persons. He drew a fine of \$100 and a jail sentence of 30 days, and immediately began serving his sentence.

Sarkis Pilibosian, Waukegan, must pay damages of \$7,500 for injuries inflicted on John Brown, aged 20, whom he ran down with his automobile while the youth was riding his bicycle on Dugdale road on July 9, 1921, according to a verdict returned by a jury in circuit court last week. It was one of the largest verdicts ever allowed here in a similar case.

**NORTH SHORE LINE
BUYING EQUIPMENT**

Ten New Coaches, Including Two Observation Cars; Other New Facilities

The Chicago and North Shore electric railroad has given an order for \$750,000 worth of new equipment including ten new coaches, to be delivered during February, reports say.

There will be two observation cars which are an innovation for the local road and will help to bring it up to the standard of the crack transcontinental limited trains on the steam roads. There will be seven steel cars and one modern diner. The diner alone will cost \$35,000 it is reported.

Recently twelve merchandise cars were purchased for use on the same system. The cost of these cars was \$15,000 each. These cars will permit of the expansion of the express service on the line which is growing with great bounds.

**DEER HUNTERS ARE
INTERESTED IN LAW**

Local Nimrods Hear Wisconsin Contemplates Two Years Closed Season

Lake county deer hunters are much interested in the report reaching here from Madison, Wis., to the effect that a law will be introduced in the Wisconsin legislature soon to close the deer season all over the state for a period of one or two years. Assemblyman John Peltier of the state asserts that at the present rate of killing from 3,000 to 4,000 deer a year the number soon will be practically exterminated.

The law which allows hunters to shoot one deer in a season and prevents their shooting anything but bucks had the effect of reducing the annual slaughter.

This law, it is claimed, has prevented the accidental killing of many hunters. Under the previous law which permitted the killing of any kind of deer hunters frequently would take a shot at any moving object without ascertaining whether it was a buck, doe or man. Now they must get close enough to a deer to be sure it is a buck.

If a closed season is established in Wisconsin, local deer hunters will be obliged to go to Michigan or Minnesota for their yearly sport.
