




**RARE SCANDAL IN  
PARK BIRD COLONY****THIS IS NEW STUFF**

Yellowstone Pelican Is Branded Fish "Hog" by Professor; Something About the Pelican Flock

Excitement is rife in the wild animal community of the park since the scandal about Mr. Pelican received public attention. The ducks are quacking it and the bob cats are scattering it broadcast in their shrill voices.

Throughout all the whispers and nudges of neighbors as he passes, Mr. Pelican maintains his stately mein, seemingly unconscious of the jibes of the multitude. His actions would indicate he still holds his valued place in the community.

**Professor Starts It**

His trouble started with the charge by Prof. Henry B. Ward, head of the department of zoology of the University of Illinois, that he is a trout "hog" and violator of all the tenets of good sportsmanship. Proof of these charges probably will mean that Mr. Pelican will become an outcast with everyone's door closed to him and everyone's hand against him.

Professor Ward is conducting an exhaustive investigation for the federal bureau of fisheries at Lake Yellowstone in Yellowstone Park as to the relationship between the pelican and the trout supply. His investigation, which has been progressing several weeks, will continue through the present season.

**Aristocratic Colony**

The flock of pelicans that live and breed on Lake Yellowstone numbers about 400. They "summer" aristocratically at the lake, feasting on the best the land affords from the spring until September, then go to their winter resorts along the Gulf of Mexico.

The bird diets almost exclusively on fish, and so far as the Yellowstone and other Rocky Mountain lakes and streams are concerned, this means exclusively on trout. He estimates that the 400 pelicans consume more trout than are taken during an entire season by sportsmen.

The pelican is no respecter of size limits or open season, Professor Ward charges. He declared he had seen a platoon of 35 pelicans ranged across a stream in regular formation, preying on the trout as they swam up to spawn. Hitherto, the stream had yielded trout eggs by the millions but hatchery men this year could gather only a fraction of the normal amount.

**Above Reproach**

The fact is granted that Mr. Pelican's home life is above reproach. He is a good provider, a good husband and father and is strictly monogamous. For the 400 birds in the lake flock, there are just 200 nests; one for each couple and one mate for each bird.

If further investigation justify it, Professor Ward will ask the federal government to bar the pelicans as summer visitors from the park.

**NO CLAIMANT FOR  
MINOR HEIR FUND**

State Has Sum of Money Which  
Has Lain for Years in  
the Treasury

Contrary to the usual popularity of money in the state treasury, there is one fund that has no claimants, never changes and has lain in the treasury without being touched. It is known as the "unknown and minor heirs fund."

No eloquence of the imagination can touch to life the lost and roving heirs who may at one time have been legitimate claimants to this money. It was collected and deposited in the state treasury by county officials before the system of county public administrations was established. The fund now amounts to \$6,806.07.

It has been held all these years on the chance that some heir might bob up to lay claim to it. Some day, the treasurer states the legislature will be asked to appropriate it to some state purpose.

**CEMENT LACKING  
FOR NEW ROADS**

Highway Supt. Advised Contract  
for 1923 State Paving  
Soon Awarded

Charles E. Russel, county superintendent of highways today received word from Springfield that the contracts for cement for road construction are about to be let by the state highway department but that Lake county probably cannot be furnished with cement for work to be let this year.

The state, however, expects to furnish the county with sufficient cement to take care of last year's jobs under contract. Lake county can get only what the contractors are able to store between now and early spring. The price to the state will be about \$1.60 to \$1.65 per barrel and the county will have to pay around 15 cents a barrel more than last year. By getting the cement from the state the county usually gets it for a trifle less than by buying it privately.
