The prize cup is now on display in Bro. Schneider's window and will be presented to the winners at tomorrow night's meeting, in the club rooms.

Four-Club League

With the windup of the Elks league season tonight a four-club league will be organized to go two rounds, bring them up to the big Illinois State meet time which will be the final big meet of the season, this meet will be conducted on the Peterson alleys in Chicago, so we have yet to enter from this city the following tournaments: Odd Fellows at Chicago, Illinois Bowling Ass'n at Chicago, and Fred G. Smith's big annual classic at Milwaukee, the Arcade Tournament, which runs beginning the last week in April.

K. of C. Tourney

Two fast Oilmette K. of C. bowling teams will be held on the Bensinger Randolph alleys Saturday afternoon at 2:00 o'clock in the big annual inter-state K. of C. tournament now going on there. Captains Gregory Sheahan and Matt Skiel, will also lead the two Oilmette to Milwaukee later in the month in the first annual K. of C. national meet. Highland Park members are Sheahan, Skiel, Whyte, Clark, Lencioni and Greenslade. Three hundred and twenty-five teams will shoot in this meet which runs the same time as the big A. B. C. tournament.

Win Prizes

George Rudolph and Paddy White took last week's two-men tournament at the Majestic with 1212 pins. Rudolph and J. Picchiotti finished second with 1182 pins, Rudy also collecting high three-game prize with 626 pins, while Paddy knocked off the high game prize with a 231 count.

Bob Greenslade and Tom Clark will tackle a pair of Chicago league bowlers in a little two man match at 8:30 Friday, (tomorrow) night at the Majestic.

Takes Individual Meet

Bob Greenslade wins last weeks individual meet at the Majestic, with M. Skiel and Geo. Rudolph finishing on his heels, this affair will be a weekly event and will be conducted on Saturdays and Sundays in order to accommodate bowlers from out of town, it is a five game total pin event, with an entry fee of \$5.00 a man, which also includes his bowling.
