**STATE GETS ONLY EIGHT PER CENT**

**HOW TAXES ARE DIVIDED**

School Funds Largest Share of Total; Auto License Fees Pay For Bond Issue and Interest

A considerable portion of the funds required for state expenses in Illinois now is raised by other means than direct taxation. This method of providing funds also is used by many other states, some of which raise all revenue required by indirect taxation. The building of hard roads with funds created by motor license fees is one form of indirect taxation.

Since the subject of hard roads has obscured almost every other public topic in Illinois lately, many persons not familiar with the matter have been led to believe that another bond issue would increase taxation.

**License Fees Pay It**

Nothing could be further from the truth. Motor car owners know that they will continue to pay license fees, and that the money will be spent somehow by the state. The law authorizing the car owners good highways over which to ride, privilege in return for their license fees, to be enjoyed by all who drive.

"Do you know," asked Governor Small the other day of a crowd of road boosters, one of the many to call upon him, "where your direct tax dollar goes? Do you know that, of the \$233,467,435 collected in 1922, only eight per cent is for all state purposes?"

**How Tax is Distributed**

The governor then pointed out, quoting from the records, that the remaining ninety-two per cent collected is for county, road, (county roads, not bond issue highways), township, city and village, school and park taxes. The largest item in the list is for schools, which figure 41 per cent of the whole.

**NORTH SHORE LINE PLANS IMPROVEMENT**

**TO EXPAND THE SERVICE**

Thousands of Dollars to Be Spent in Line; According to Reports; New Cars Bought

Plans involving the expenditure of hundreds of thousands of dollars for improvements in the service and equipment of the Chicago, North Shore and Milwaukee railway, are announced by President Britton I. Budd. The expansion, Mr. Budd says, is to develop the freight service between Chicago and Milwaukee and to make the system one of the most up-to-date electric railways in the country.

Freight service between Chicago and Milwaukee has resulted in a heavy volume of business. To meet this new demand, Mr. Budd said, his company has ordered fifty gondolas to haul granite from quarries located near Racine, Wis., and ten merchandise dispatch cars to cost \$15,000 each. One diner costing \$35,000 and ten steel passenger coaches will be added to the passenger service. This equipment, it is estimated will cost \$50,000. An electric locomotive, also will be added to the five others now in operation on the north end of the line. This means an additional expenditure of \$27,000.

During February ten coaches were received for the Chicago North Shore lines. At that time an order was given for two observation cars, seven steel passenger cars and one modern diner.

The demand for freight service on the North Shore line is growing so fast that it is difficult to supply the additional facilities. The gross revenue from this branch of service was \$738,896 in the previous year.

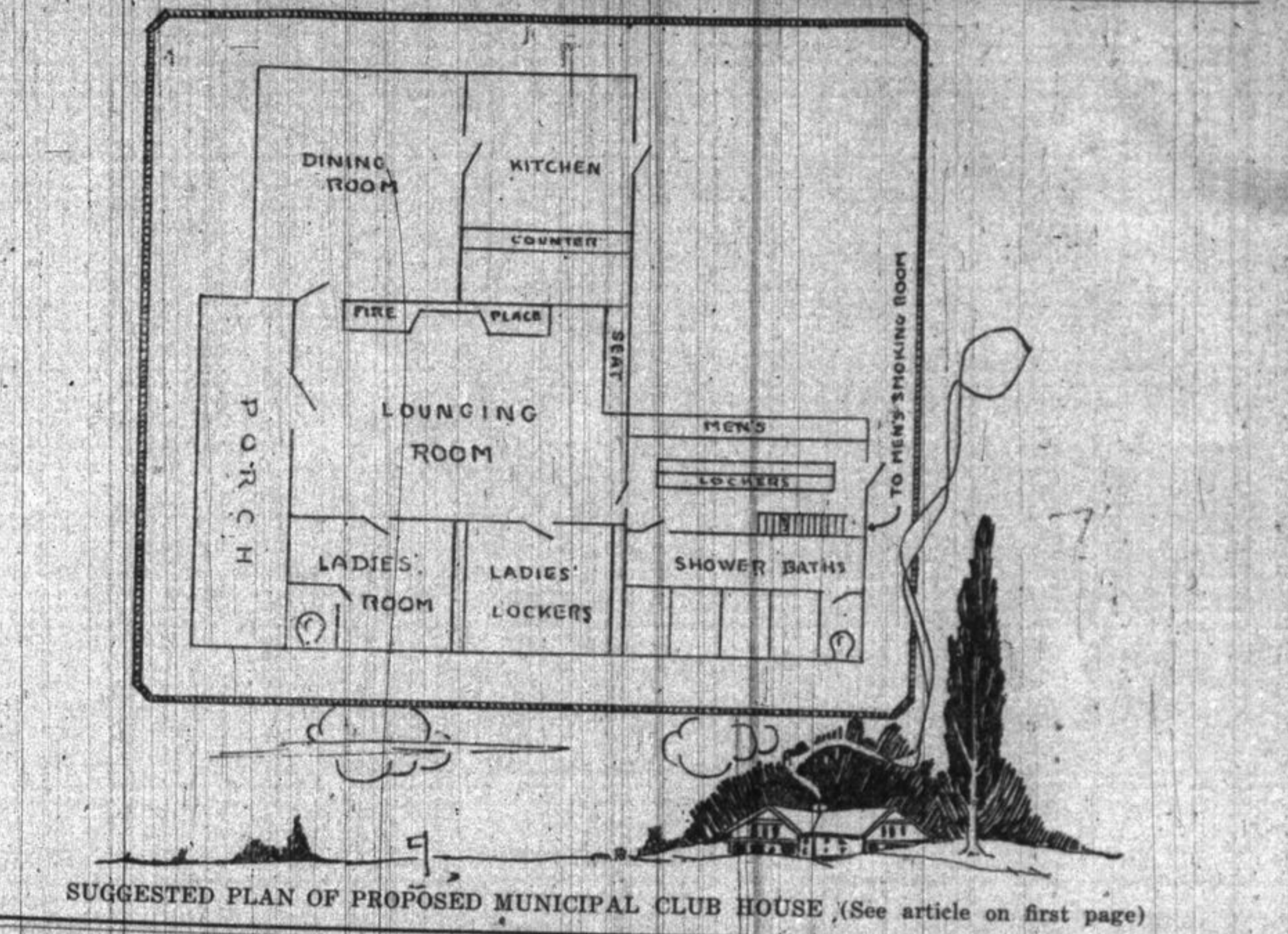
