## TOO MANY KILLED ON RAIL, HE SAYS

### CORONER IN WARNING

People Too Careless of "Stop, Look, Listen" Signals, In His Opinion, Urges More Care

"Stop, Look, Listen."

That is an old warning that would be good policy to turn a tuned ear to, Dr. John L. Taylor, of Libertyville, coroner of the county advises.

It is a railroad warning and at the rate that the people are getting killed on the tracks it would be a good warning to keep in mind, he declares.

In seven days alone there were three people in the county who met their death under the wheels of trains. Just a few days ago Innocent Linewich, of Waukegan, was killed by a North Western train, a few days later Chris Christiansen, of Fox Lake, was found mangled on the tracks of the St. Paul railway near Rondout, and Sunday Floyd Protok, of Chicago, was slain by the North Western at the Waukegan depot as he hurried the fence to catch a Chicago bound train.

The list shows that people should be more careful, Coroner Taylor declares.

When summer comes it is even more hazardous. The large number of people touring the country in automobiles and the increase in trains on the summer runs makes life valueless if great caution is not exercised, according to him.

"That 'Stop, Look, Listen' sign means just what it says, he declares, and for that reason it should be given just as much recognition as life itself.

## COUNTIES UNITED IN ROADS PROGRAM

### ON TONNAGE REDUCTION

Lake, Kendall, Will, DuPage and McHenry Represented at Meeting Held Last Week, Geneva

Road building plans were discussed last week by supervisors, road officials and good road boosters, of Lake county in a meeting at Geneva, Ill., at which five counties were represented.

Those counties sending representatives to the meeting besides Lake were Kendall, Will, Kane, DuPage, and McHenry.

The reduction of tonnage over unimproved roads was one of the important projects taken up at the meeting. They decided that 8,000 pounds should be the limit for trucks carrying loads over the roads. The present limit is 24,000 pounds.

Discussion of the hard road program for the next four years also received considerable attention from the members of the meeting.

One of the questions discussed was the patrolling of unimproved state aid roads in Kane county. This work is to be started in April 1, J. A. Bloomquist, chairman of the Kane county road and bridge committee, said. There will be eight patrolmen, to be appointed by the county superintendent of highways.

Senator Kessinger announced that Supervisor John Russell of Kendall county, is busy securing the right of way for the Lincoln highway through that county. As soon as the right of way is secured, work will be started on the stretch of hard road from Plainfield to Aurora, also on the paving of the Cannon Ball trail, from Aurora to a point near Sandwich. The latter road will also pass through Kendall county.

## PRINCIPAL TUBBS, NEW TRIER, QUILTS

Resigns to Devote Time to Studies at University Of Chicago

Eston V. Tubbs, principal of New Trier township high school for the past four years, has tendered his resignation to the board of education to be effective April 1. The resignation was accepted with regret when Mr. Tubbs explained that he was forced to give up his work here in order to devote all his time to post graduate work at the University of Chicago, looking toward the degree of Doctor of Philosophy.
