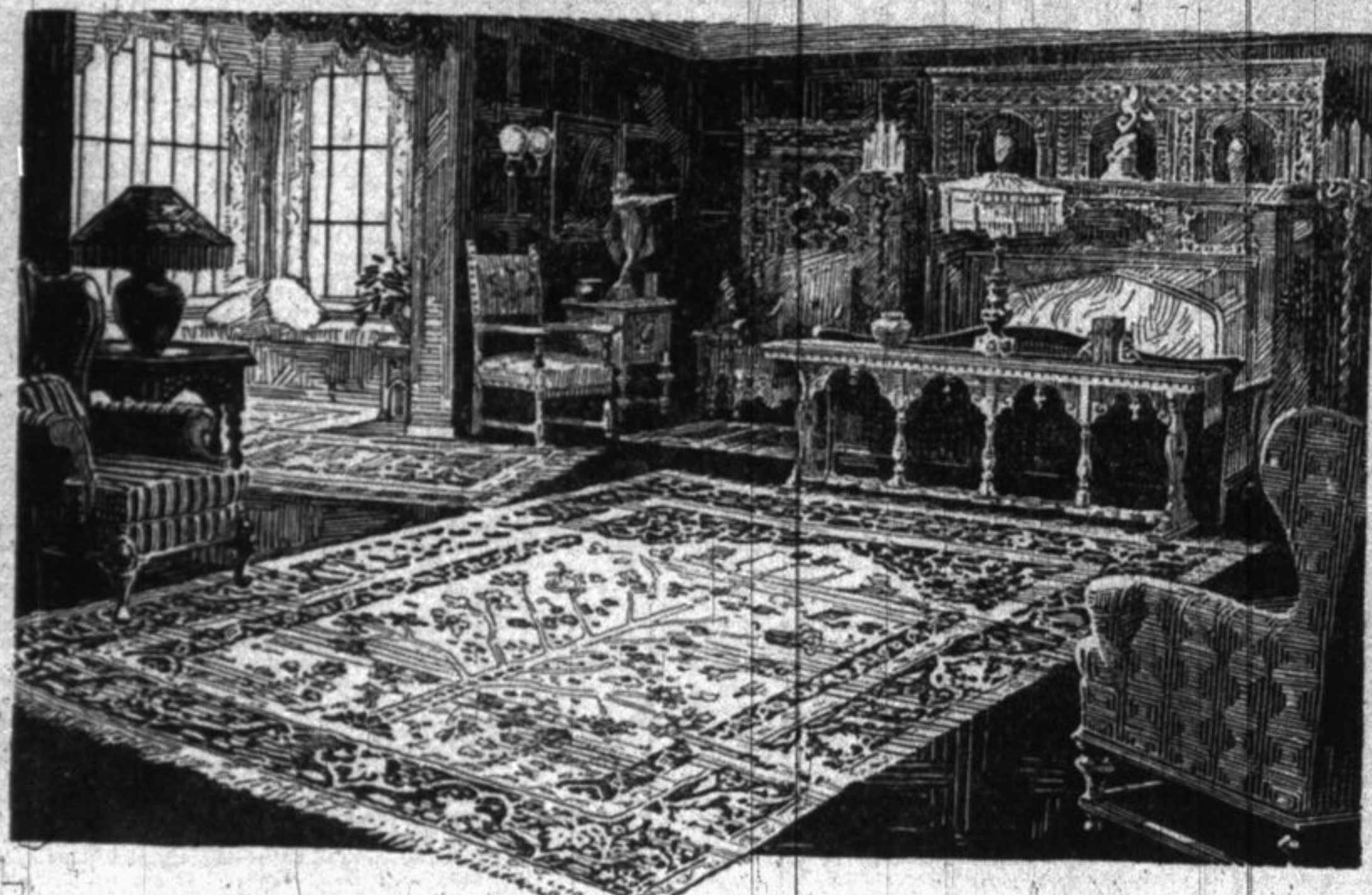

MUCH MONEY SPENT IN NEAR EAST AID

TWELVE MILLION TOTAL

Expenditures in Last Year Are Greatly Augmented by The Smyrna Disaster; the Report Says

Disbursements of \$12,230,325 during 1922 were reported to the annual meeting of the board of trustees of Near East Relief, held at the Yale club recently. This amount is \$3,000,000 more than expenditures of the previous year because of the Smyrna disaster.

Sudden Increase

"Our normal child welfare program had to be suddenly increased to meet the tremendous immediate task of adult relief which simply had to be taken care of by our organization, the only one on the ground," said Charles V. Vickrey, General Secretary. "The transfer of orphans to Greece, Syria and elsewhere will give larger opportunity for plans of self-support and industrial development," said Mr. Vickrey in reporting on the transfer of all the Near East Relief orphans from the interior of Turkey to places of safety.

Save Many Lives

The Bishop of Smyrna is quoted as saying that American relief workers saved at least 200,000 lives in the Smyrna area alone. Cable reports to Near East Relief headquarters accounted for more than 400,000 refugees evacuated from Smyrna to various islands.

Some idea of the magnitude of emergency operations immediately following the fire appears in the report from the island of Mitylene: "2,175,022 rations of bread, flour and hard-tack issued; 33,229 rations of milk issued to babies; 10,550 persons supplied with old clothes and shoes; 11,090 hospital and clinic treatments." Similar emergency service was rendered at Chios, Brusa, Samos, Crete, Salonika and elsewhere.

SAYS CHICAGO WILL HAVE 8 MILLIONS

Highland Park Engineer Tells Metropolitan Conference of Growth

Within the next twenty-five years Greater Chicago will become a municipality of 8,000,000 inhabitants, and the planning and development of a metropolitan district must be made with that objective in view.

Jacob L. Crane, Jr., of Highland Park, and municipal engineer of Chicago, impressed that point Saturday on delegates to the metropolitan planning conference called by the city club of Chicago to consider the question of the future growth of the city.

Whereas the city proper today covers 200 square miles, with nearly 3,000,000 citizens, the Chicago of 1950, he predicted, would spread over an area of 1,000 square miles, embracing in a great metropolitan district suburbs and towns now several miles from the city limits.

Outside District Grows Rapidly
In the 800 square miles in the district outside the present municipality the population is increasing three times as fast as in Chicago itself, he said.

"In 1950," he said, "there will be 3,000,000 persons living in this district outside of the city. In other words, the district will add 2,500,000 persons, while Chicago is adding only 2,000,000."

TRACK MEET HELD SOON AT EVANSTON

Annual Interscholastic Contests March 24 in Field and Tank Events

The Northwestern University national interscholastic track and swimming meet scheduled for March 24th, is to be four times greater this year than last according to replies received by Hilding Haegen, star dash man, who is managing the meet.

Chicago high schools, fairly accurate indicators of entries to come, have answered in force. Some already entered are McKinley, Lake View, Lane Tech., Senn, New Trier, Evanston, Deerfield, and University. The latest outside entry is Piqua, Ohio. Entered from University high city track champions, is Jean Goodwillie, sprinter and hurdler who was top man with twenty-three points in the recent Chicago university interscholastic. The only man likely to offer him serious opposition will be Cameron from Evanston.

Walter H. Eckersall, well-known sports writer, has notified Athletic Director Dana M. Evans that he will gladly act as starter and referee at the game.
