**BRIEF NEWS ITEMS FROM LAKE COUNTY**

**NEIGHBORHOOD JOTTINGS**

**Happenings Here and There About the County of General Interest; News of County Seat**

A section of North Chicago comprising five blocks along 19th street has been purchased for the purpose of building 300 bungalow homes, according to a statement made before the council by Jos. Jadrich, an attorney, representing the interest of a widow associated with the Creamery Package company. He refuses to reveal her name.

Theodore H. Durst, president of the Security Savings Bank and Leslie Nash George, owner of George's Cafe were the two majority nominees in the republican primaries last week when Waukegan voters selected two candidates out of a field of five. Mr. Durst getting a vote of 2821 against Mr. George's 1527, thereby having 1294 votes to the good over the second man.

Charles E. Russell, county superintendent of highways, was in Springfield last week consulting with the state highway department concerning the ironing out of the right of way of state aid road route No. 21 through Grayslake. A delegation from Grayslake also participated in the conference.

It took a jury in circuit court early Tuesday evening barely an hour to return a verdict of "guilty" in the case of Simon Rodriguez, charged with voluntary manslaughter following the death of Martin Drohovesky, a fellow worker at the plant of the Vuncan-Louisville Smelting company in North Chicago.

W. J. Smith and F. G. Smith last week closed a deal for the purchase of the old McAlister hospital and the nurses' home adjacent, in Waukegan. It comprises 80 1/2 feet on North avenue by 150 feet on Franklin street. The hospital is three floors and basement and the hospital folks plan vacating it on May 1, when the new Victory Memorial hospital will be opened.

After months of legal battling, the name of Zion City has been changed to "Zion" by the Chicago & Northwestern railway company. The change became effective Monday, under an order of G. B. Vilas, general superintendent, dated March 8.

Plans for a special building and loan drive to follow up the recent building boom of North Chicago were launched at the meeting of the Sheridan Road Building & Loan officials last week. A drive was planned for April, with a special stockholders meeting April 5 in the auditorium to prepare the way.

The Victory Memorial hospital directors took important actions last week when they made a sale of the old McAlister hospital, decided to get designs and call for bids very shortly on a nurses home for the new hospital and also took up the matter of disposing of the North avenue frontage of the Victory Memorial hospital site.


The Rev. Joseph B. Lauerman, pastor of St. Joseph's church, Waukegan, for three and a half years, has been transferred. He goes to Mont Clair St. William's church, Chicago.
