FINGER PRINTS AS USED IN THE NAVY

Many Interesting Circumstances Cited to Show Value of the Plan in Keeping up Naval Records

In the Navy Department at Washington, D. C., under the direction of the Bureau of Navigation, is an office which has on file the finger prints of each enlisted man who has enlisted in the navy since January 1, 1907. Through the operation of this system, it is impossible for any man, whose finger prints are on file, to lose his

identity in case of death. "This system is used primarily to prevent undesirable men from entering the service under assumed names. Since this system was installed on January 1, 1907, 13418 men have been identified. These men had previously been in the service and were either deserters or dishonorably discharged from the service and were attempting to return under assumed names, but as soon as their finger prints reached the department, their identities were immediately estab-

Over Million Records The navy finger office now has on file over a million records which have all been properly classified and can be readily found within a few minutes. The system in use is the "Henry System of Classification and Uses of Finger Prints." There are only four general types of patterns used; the arch, the loop, the whorl and the composite. The human hand is hundred thousand secondary classification numbers. A man who has had his finger prints taken and placed on file in the bureau can not rename without the fact becoming known, for when his finger print record is taken and classified under his assumed name, they will be identical with the first record obtained. Used Since 400 B. C.

Finger prints have been used since 400 B. C. and since that time there has never been found two finger prints that are identical. It would appear beyond conception that in so vast a number of individual leaves in the forest there should be no two without points of differences, and scientists state that there has never been a man who has found two leaves that were exactly alike. This has been found the case in finger prints. Not since the year 400 B. C. have there ever been found two finger prints that were exactly alike. The contour of the pattern may be the ame, but the ridge characteristic, upon which identity is established, are invariably unlike in different individuals.

No Two Alike The possibility of a ridge characteristic appearing in the same place in two different individuals fingers is one in a million, and as each finger has about sixty-five ridge characteristics, it can be readily seen that it would be impossible for two different individuals to have the same ridge characteristics in their fingers. By making a comparison of all ten fin-gers, it would be found beyond a shadow of a doubt that no different individuals would have the same finger

The finger print system has been found to be absolutely reliable by all police departments throughout the world, and is the only absolute system of identification known today.
