AIM OF NEW BODY

PERSHING AT FORT

HIGHWOOD SCHOOL PUPILS

Cheer and Wave Flags; General in Inspection of Fort, Confers D.S.M. on Hodges; Moseley Host

With waving of flags and shouts of welcome, four hundred school children of the Oak Terrace school, Highwood, adjoining Fort Sheridan, ranging from the first to the eighth grade, met General Pershing Monday, on his way to inspect the troops. General Pershing delayed his inspection and addressed the children, telling them how proud he was to have them here and concluding with the remark that they were the coming men and women of America and upon them we were relying to defend and uphold the constitution.

General Pershing then reviewed the troops and inspected the post.

 Prior to the inspection the general of the army conferred the D. S. M. recently awarded Major General Harry F. Hodges, retired, for exceptionally meritorious and distinguished services in a position of great responsibility.

Present at the ceremony were Mrs. Hodges; Mrs. Albert H. Acher, daughter; Mrs. Arthur Aldis, daughter-in-law; Mr. and Mrs. Graham Aldis; General Geo. V. H. Moseley, his staff; Mr. Aldis was aide to the General during the war.

After these ceremonies General Pershing received the officers and their wives at the Officers' Club.

War-Time Cronies

General Pershing and General Moseley are war-time cronies. When our army in France was organized as a separate American army, Moseley was recalled from the front lines and placed on General Pershing's staff to control the movements of troops and supplies. It was he whom Pershing chose to send to Holland, representing the American government, to secure the right to pass our troops and supplies along the Rhine through Holland. After overcoming many obstacles, General Moseley succeeded in his venture while the allied government representatives were still debating how this could be accomplished.
