BOWLERS ENTER BIG STATE TOURNAMENT

Highland Park bowlers have entered the big state tourney, sending six teams, 14 doubles, and 27 singles. The second largest delegation of local pin knights to even enter this big annual classic, the records show that in the year 1918 ten Highland Park teams were entered. Four clubs were entered in both 1917 and 1922, three in 1920, two each in 1916, and 1921, and one team in 1919. Records also show that in 1920 the Majestic team of this city won the out-of-Cook-championship in 1920 (with 2762) while in 1916 the "All Stars," of this city were the outside champs, with 2709 pins. Several other good marks have been registered since 1916. When the local teams first entered this meet last year A. Ori and J. Mizzi, finished second in the doubles with the total of 1232 pins, having been nosed out of first place by fifteen pins on the last day of the meet, their second place was good for \$145, while J. Guerri and R. Turelli, finished sixth with 1219 pins, their prize was \$95.00.

Showing how close the contest was it is of interest to notice that on the first ballot Kirschner received 17 votes, McCullough 16 and Holdridge one. When the second ballot was called for apparently one of the men who voted for Kirschner switched to McCullough and the man who voted for Holdridge also switched to McCullough thus giving Mr. McCullough a majority of two votes over the Cuba man.
