HOW MINORITY OF RUSSIANS DOMINATE

Rule Millions by Purely Military Force Because of Their Organization

The population of Russia in Europe is about 130,000,000. The number of Communists in Russia is 817,000, according to the official census of that party. Of those in good and regular standing, with a right to have their say in all matters affecting Russia and the Soviets, there are 410,430. This same census shows 117,924 candidates for full party membership and 289,839 young Communists. The Red Army and Navy shelter 90,000 of the regular members and 83,890 feed at the public trough as government employees.

All then of the acknowledged Communists in communist Russia, including candidates, probationaries and young Reds, total but a fraction more than one-half of 1 per cent of the European Russians. They are the rulers of about 130,000,000 west of the Urals and possibly 35,000,000 Siberians. After a fashion their writs run from the Dneiper and the Baltic to the Sea of Okhotsk and the Straits of Bering. They have 800,000 bayonets and have kept themselves in power for five years.

Yet there are skeptical souls who are inclined to hoot at the power of an organized minority!

HOW CANADA AIDS ITS EX-SOLDIERS

MANY GET LAND GRANTS

Operation of Settlement Board Proves Satisfactory; Many Thousands Assisted In This Way

The figures of operation of the Soldier Settlement Board of Canada, the body organized for the purpose of settling discharged Canadian warriors upon Canadian farm lands, covering the year 1922, disclose a gratifying continuance of the success which characterized the work of former years, and go to yet further prove, in a very definite manner, that the spirit which actuated the Canadian army in war time has been carried into the years of peace, and the men who, upon discharge, elected to find re-establishment by way of the land have, for the main part, steadfastly adhered to their resolves and have uniformly been successful in the face of, at times, hard and discouraging conditions.

Many Settlements

The Soldier Settlement Board of Canada has accounted for the settlement on lands of the Dominion of a total of 28,940 men, of whom 22,548 have been assisted with loans and an additional 6,392 settled on Crown lands without loans. Settlement figures to the end of the year 1922 show that loans amounting to \$95,235,902 have been made to ex-warriors, divided among the provinces in the following order:—Alberta, \$26,974,934; Saskatchewan, \$22,739,281; Manitoba, \$15,184,883; British Columbia, \$14,221,218; Ontario, \$7,483,650; Quebec, \$2,252,600; New Brunswick, \$1,921,505; Nova Scotia, \$1,940,122; and Prince Edward Island \$977,704.

Year's Operations Satisfactory

In the opinion of the Board the year's operations were considered generally satisfactory from the standpoint of repayments of loans which cover a twenty-year period. In past years, successes of these soldier farmers have enabled them to complete their payments very much ahead of time, some three hundred in 1920 having paid off their total indebtedness. In 1922, the Province of Ontario showed the best results with 73 per cent of the amount due by soldier settlers having been paid into the board. The district of Regina in Saskatchewan was second with 70 per cent of payments made. The Maritime Provinces show 57 per cent paid and the Prince Albert district of Saskatchewan 56 per cent paid.

NORTHWESTERN MAKES SCHEDULE CHANGES

Suburban Train Time Advanced One Hour to Conform to Daylight Saving

The schedules of practically all Chicago and Northwestern local trains in the Chicago Suburban district will be advanced one hour to conform with the Daylight Saving ordinance, on Sunday April 29.

The Viking, a new, fast, solid, all steel daylight train for St. Paul and Minneapolis, equipped with modern observation parlor car, dining car and coaches, will leave Chicago daily 10:25 a. m., arriving St. Paul 10:20 p. m. and Minneapolis 10:50 p. m. The Viking will leave Minneapolis 8:15 a. m., St. Paul 9:00 a. m., and arrive Chicago 9:10 p. m.

A new night train will leave Minneapolis 6:20 p. m., St. Paul 7:00 p. m., and arrive Chicago 6:55 a. m., making ten daily trains between Chicago and the Twin Cities.

The Northwestern Limited, the fast overnight train leaving Chicago 6:30 p. m. for St. Paul and Minneapolis, will arrive St. Paul 7:05 a. m., instead of 7:20 a. m., Minneapolis 7:40 a. m., instead of 7:55 a. m.

The Rochester-Minnesota Special will leave Chicago daily at 8:00 p. m. instead of 7:30 p. m.
