YOUNG BANDITS ARE SENTENCED TO JAIL

Trio Who Held Up Aynsley Store Plead Guilty in Court, Begin Terms

That the way of the transgressor is hard still is evidenced again in the sentences imposed this week on the three young men charged with holding up Dean Aynsley's store, North Green Bay road, several weeks ago. The three are Anthony Ognette, Frank Del Rego and Joseph De Matteo.

The three Chicago bandits dropped into Aynsley's store one evening and ordered the proprietor to hold up his hands. He complied, but just then the sound of a motorcycle stopping outside frightened the bandits and they fled. Chief of Police Maroney soon rounded up the trio, who are believed to have attempted other hold-ups the same night, and they were held in jail at Waukegan under bonds of \$2,000, which they were unable to provide.

Tuesday of this week they pleaded guilty. Del Rego was sentenced to 30 more days in jail, and the two others got 40 days each.

FAME FOR THESE WAS UNEXPECTED

LEAPED INTO LIMELIGHT

Henry Irving, A.M. Hutchinson in List; Mrs. Ward, Robt. Burns and Others Suddenly Famous

It is not always recognized that Sir Henry Irving stepped from obscurity into fame in one night. He had persuaded the manager of the Lyceum to put on "The Bells" in which he was to play the part of Mathias.

The manager was more than dubious of success, but on a certain Saturday

night in 1881 the piece was put on, with the understanding that if it was not received with favor the theatre would close its doors on the Monday. The furore created by Irving's acting of the part of Mathias has never had its equal since, says an English writer. Not only London, but the whole country rang with the news of his triumph. He awoke on Sunday morning to find himself the most talked-of man in Britain; and probably, for the moment, the whole world.

Hutchinson's Case

A. S. M. Hutchinson had an almost similar experience, the only difference being that his emergence into the limelight of universal fame was neither so sudden nor so dramatic. But it was the news from America that his book, "If Winter Comes," was "selling like hot cakes," and that everybody

was discussing it, that made him suddenly famous.

Mrs. Humphrey Ward awoke one morning to find herself famous. She had issued a book entitled "Robert Elsmere," of which possibly few have heard in the ordinary way. But soon after its publication it had the great good fortune to fall into the hands of Gladstone, and its heterodox religious views awakened his controversial spirit which was on the watch for just such occasions.
