**WILL ADJUST TAXES
UNDER COURT RULING**

Attorney Gail Says Report Will Be Made in Accordance With Recent Decision

Highland Park, Ill.
April 24th, 1923.

Gentlemen:—The Supreme court on the 18th. inst., held valid the thirty per cent raise in valuation in Highland Park made by the Board of Review on the ground that objectors' evidence did not establish an arbitrary or fraudulent assessment. It appeared from the tabulation of sales made in 1919 that the assessment was 53 per cent of the sales value within the city and without the city the assessment was 15 per cent of the sales values.

The practical results of this decision is explained in my letter published in your issue of the 19th. inst.

The Supreme court in the same opinion sustained objections to illegal tax levies of approximately \$185,000.

I wish to announce through your columns that an adjustment of the 1921 taxes in accordance with the opinion will be attended to by all attorneys representing objectors and a report made in the near future.

**GREYHOUND OLDEST
OF CANINE BREEDS**

The claim of the greyhound to be the oldest and most conservative of all the recognized canine breeds, has been strengthened by the discovery of designs representing this type in hunting scenes at Luxor. Greyhounds, not very different in size and shape from those competing in the coursing for the Waterloo Cup were used by sporting contemporaries of the Pharaoh Tutankhamen. Greyhounds were probably introduced into Britain by the traders from Tyre and Sidon, and from earliest history they have been the favorites of the nobility. The sport of coursing grew in favor continually and during the reign of Queen Elizabeth was conducted under definite rules, the first coursing club being formed in 1776 at Swaffham. The National Coursing club, now the supreme authority for the regulation of coursing meetings, was inaugurated in 1858, when the Greyhound Stud-Book was started.

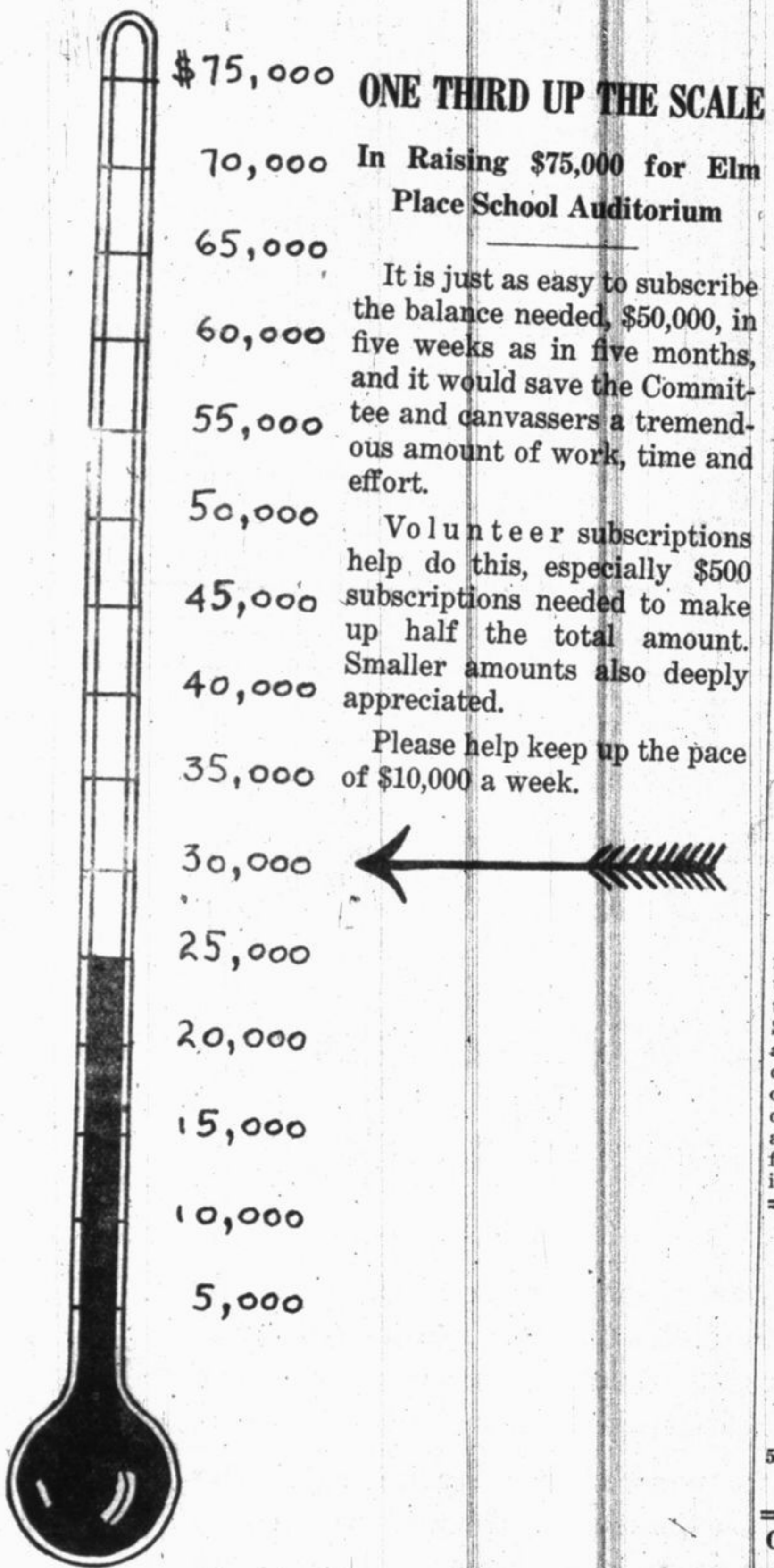
