**CREATION GOES ON
 IN NEW PROCESSES**
TRYING TO TRACE ORIGIN

**Story of Rocks Tell Scientists
 Much; Evolution Still In
 Progress Is Their
 Belief**

Creation is not yet complete. The changing land forms, the amazing alterations which a generation can see in the development and distribution of plants and animals, the reclamation of farm lands from sea bottoms, the change of deserts to orchards all form part of a progressive creation. Such is the opinion of geologists, as voiced by Professor T. T. Quirke, head of the department of geology in the University of Illinois.

"The origin of the earth is not known; to say that God created the earth explains nothing as to the method of its creation," says Prof. Quirke. "Scientists do not try to explain away creation, they merely try to trace the order of its accomplishment."

Story of Rocks

"The story of the rocks and the traces of life they contain show clearly a long line of changing plants and animals as well as changing seas and land. The world of forty million years ago was altogether different from the world today. The trees were strange and sprawling, mammals were not yet created, the pleasant fruit trees had not appeared, man was not even foreshadowed, the bread giving grains on which man feeds had not come into existence. Yet, in due time, each in its proper place and time came to pass. If this is a creation, it is a creation by means of a progressive evolution.

"We believe that long before conditions made life possible, the earth and other planets had evolution which is still in progress. By studying other planets and stars, and by checking our theories by mathematical tests based on proved physical and chemical data, we have developed various theories as to the growth of the earth. The most up-to-date theory is named the Planetsimal Hypothesis. According to its authors, the earth is thought to have been built up by the coming together of many smaller planets, or planetesimals (little planets). After the period of growth, which now is nearly complete, conditions have gradually developed life of ever increasing complexity.

Fossils are Guides
 "Fossils make it clear that life has been improving in its forms in an or-

derly persistent manner, and it would be wild indeed for anyone to maintain that this long line of achievement has reached its pinnacle of excellence in man. Considering the cultivation of his intelligence and the abuse of his conscience, man often appears to be the most horrid, cruel, destructive of all living creations. Optimists may well observe that the earth is still in the making, that land forms are still being formed, that life, and man himself, are likewise steps in the great plan of creation, that the creation which shall be is far better than the creations of today."

**DE LUXE TRAINS ON
 SUBWAYS OF LONDON**
**Most Luxurious Ever Built And
 Modernly Equipped In
 Every Way**

The manager of London's underground railways are experimenting with several new trains of luxurious palace cars, with a view to placing their subway system ahead of anything in the world, says W. O. Senock of St. Louis, who has just returned from a visit to London. Tube travelers recently rubbed their eyes with astonishment as two splendidly appointed scarlet and white trains traveled from station to station and then disappeared. They were the experimental trains now being tested with a view to relieving the increased pressure of traffic and adding to the comfort of the passengers. Each train consisted of three coaches manufactured by five different firms, and after final test a contract will go to the successful competing company. More luxurious trains for a purely local service have never been seen. They are "fool-proof," with lighting and ventilation brought to a fine art, and almost noiseless.
