Following is a reprint from the Grace M. E. church program of Sunday, May 10th.

One of the saddest events in the history of Grace church occurred last Tuesday, May 8. Mr. Fred Juhrend, who for some time has been suffering from a serious affliction was suddenly stricken, on Monday, and the next afternoon passed away. He was 25 years old and leaves a wife and two small children, a mother and two brothers, Charles, Heinrich of Milwaukee, August Hinreich, Fort Wayne, Wm. Hinreich, Mason City, Ia., Herman Juhrend of this city and one sister, Mrs. Henry Numsen of Libertyville.

The news of his death came as a shock to the entire community; for he was known by everyone and his fine qualities of heart and mind were greatly appreciated. He and his wife were of that group of splendid young people who before and during the world war did such notable service in the Epworth League and church, for they were faithful, enthusiastic and full of good works; and Fred, as he was familiarly known, was always ready to devote his time and talents for every good work. During the past year or two, sickness in the family and his own affliction prevented him from giving much attention other than to his home and business. He was the cashier and office manager of Springer & Person's automobile agency.

The funeral service on Friday, May 11, was largely attended. Rev. H. C. Dick, former pastor assisted in the service. Mrs. Herbert Smith sang several solos, and the pastor gave a brief sermon from the text, "All ye who are about him bemoan him; and all ye that know his name say How is the Strong Staff broken and the beautiful rod."—Jeremiah 48:17.

The floral offerings were wonderfully beautiful, and quite numerous. A modest quiet man, yet resourceful and talented; a lover of life and home; true to the highest ideals and conscientious in thought and deed, he has gone from us. Sympathy with the sorrowing ones is universal.

LATE IMPROVEMENTS NOTED IN DEERFIELD

Deerfield — Several improvements have been made on South Waukegan road. The old Fred Meyer Blacksmith shop which has stood idle for a number of years, has been torn down and the lot was purchased by the Masonic club, where a club house will be erected. This community house has been moved to this lot and will be remodelled for use for the present time.

Directly across the street at the Juhrend garage, another gasoline pump has been installed and two large square electric light posts have been erected.

The interior and exterior of the George Herrmann Confectionery store on East Deerfield avenue have been modernized and made very attractive.

Deerfield is booming as it never has before. New and modern stores are being built and new residences are under construction and many new streets have been opened.

Increase in the attendance at the Deerfield school has made necessary the engagement of eight teachers for next year, instead of six, as formerly.
