

AN ORDINANCE providing that Ravine Avenue East and Southerly of the North Line of Original Lot Six (6) in Block Sixty-Eight (68) in the City of Highland Park Extended Northerly Across said Ravine Avenue be closed to Traffic on each Saturday after twelve o'clock noon, and on each Sunday and all legal holidays after May 1st until October 1st of each year beginning with the present calendar year.

Be It Ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, Lake County, Illinois:

Section 1. That RAVINE AVE-NUE east and southerly of the north line of original lot six (6) in block sixty-eight (68) in the City of Highland Park extended northerly across said Ravine Avenue be closed to traffic on each Saturday after twelve o'clock noon, and on each Sunday and all legal holidays after May 1st until October 1st of each year beginning with the present calendar year.

Section 2. Nothing in this ordinance contained shall be deemed to apply to cars or vehicles owned by or going to or from the property of residents situated east and southerly of said north line of said lot six (6) in said block sixty-eight (68).

Section 3. Any person, firm, or corporation violating the provision of this ordinance shall be fined not less than Five Dollars (\$5) nor more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100) for each and every offense.
