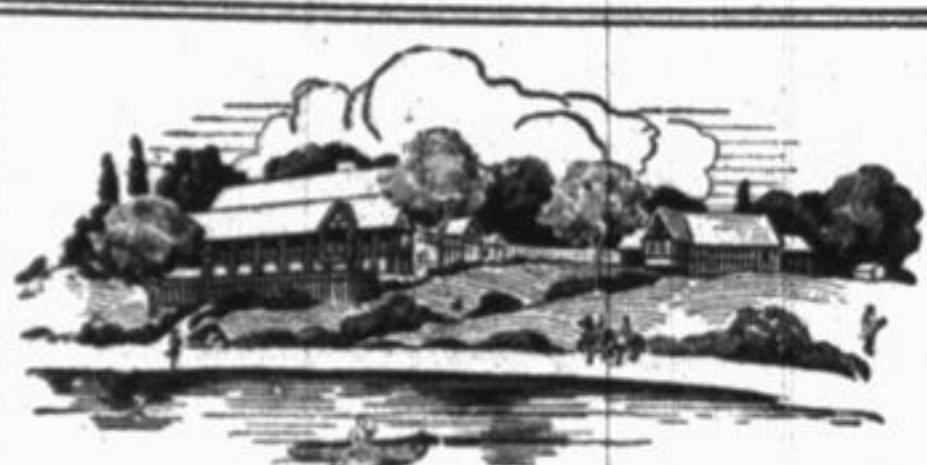

AN ORDINANCE prohibiting parking of automobiles and vehicles on Ravine Avenue east and southerly of the east line of Forest Avenue in the City of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois, after May 1st until October 1st of each year, beginning with the present calendar year.

Be it Ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, Lake County, Illinois:

Section 1. That after May 1st and until October 1st of each year beginning with the present calendar year, no person owning, controlling, driving, or operating any automobile, carriage, or other vehicle propelled or drawn by animal or other power, shall cause or permit the same to stand on that part of Ravine Avenue lying east and southerly of the east line of Forest Avenue in the City of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois.

Section 2. Nothing in this ordinance contained shall be deemed to apply to cars or vehicles owned by or going to or from the property of residents situated east and southerly of said north line of said lot six (6) in said block sixty-eight (68).

Section 3. Any person, firm, or corporation violating the provision of this ordinance shall be fined not less than Five Dollars (\$5) nor more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100) for each and every offense.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and due publication.
