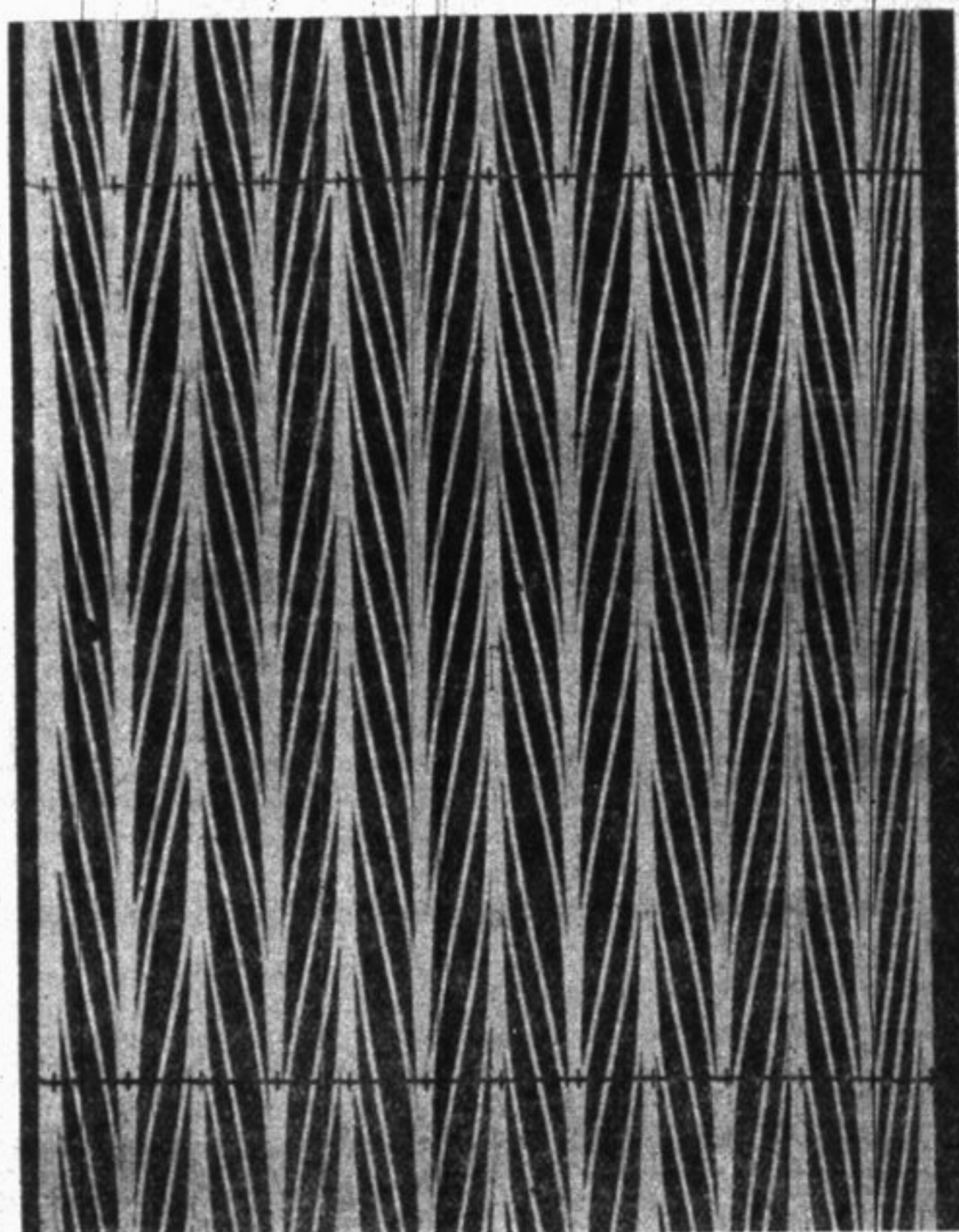

PLAN MODEL HOMES TO EMPHASIZE NEED

IS NATIONAL MOVEMENT

Better Homes in America Slogan of Promoters of Project: Public to Be Shown Best Types

A model home in each community in Chicago and environs, which will delight the heart of the housekeeper with its up-to-date convenience, its charm of arrangement and interior furnishing, and its inexpensiveness, is to be selected and equipped for demonstration week, to be observed nationally June 4 to 10, by the Better Homes in America campaign.

This is a national movement, and is to have no commercial aspects, and will be educational entirely. The governors of thirty states have endorsed the movement, and men and women prominent in educational, civic, philanthropic lines are co-operating, including Herbert Hoover, Vice-president Calvin Coolidge and many others. Mrs. Russell Tyson, chairman of the Chicago advisory council, will be assisted by a score of organizations including women's clubs, settlements, schools, and the Chicago Association of Commerce. It is expected that the campaign will greatly stimulate business, wholesome living and civic pride.

Importance of the Home

The aims of the Better Homes in America demonstrations during the week of June 4 to 10 are to emphasize the importance of the home in our national and community life, to encourage thrift for home ownership, and to give helpful suggestions regarding the selection and building of the home, its equipment and management.

An interesting feature of the week will be opening of certain model houses in the community for the public to inspect. What can be done on incomes ranging from \$1,000 to \$5,000 will be demonstrated, and budgets for each income will be posted in the rooms of the houses which represent the given income. The budgets will be made up on the basis of five members to a family.

Lectures on domestic science, home decoration, home ownership and how to achieve it, and many allied subjects will be given in many centers during that week. Further information may be obtained at the office of Mrs. Russell Tyson, 1730 Stevens building, Chicago, telephone Randolph 3131.

KANGAROOS CLIMB TREES; NEW TYPE

Kangaroos that climb trees like squirrels and keep the hours of owls have just arrived in New York from North Queensland, Australia, chaperoned by Harry C. Raven of the American Museum of Natural History.

These strange animals, which assert their freedom from convention by living higher above ground, sleeping all day and having tails that are light colored on top instead of beneath, are very rare and difficult to obtain. When snoozing peacefully among the thick branches of a tropical tree, their bodies blend so perfectly with the bark of limbs and trunk that it is almost impossible to see them from the ground below.

"It was probably because their ancestors preferred budding leaves to all other food that these kangaroos first came to live in trees," Raven explained. "As a result they are developing different characteristics. Their tails are more slender, their front legs more muscular and they have inch-long nails to help them in climbing. They are somewhat smaller than other kangaroos, standing only about three feet in height."
