GEORGE ALLEN MASON HONORED BY COLLEGE

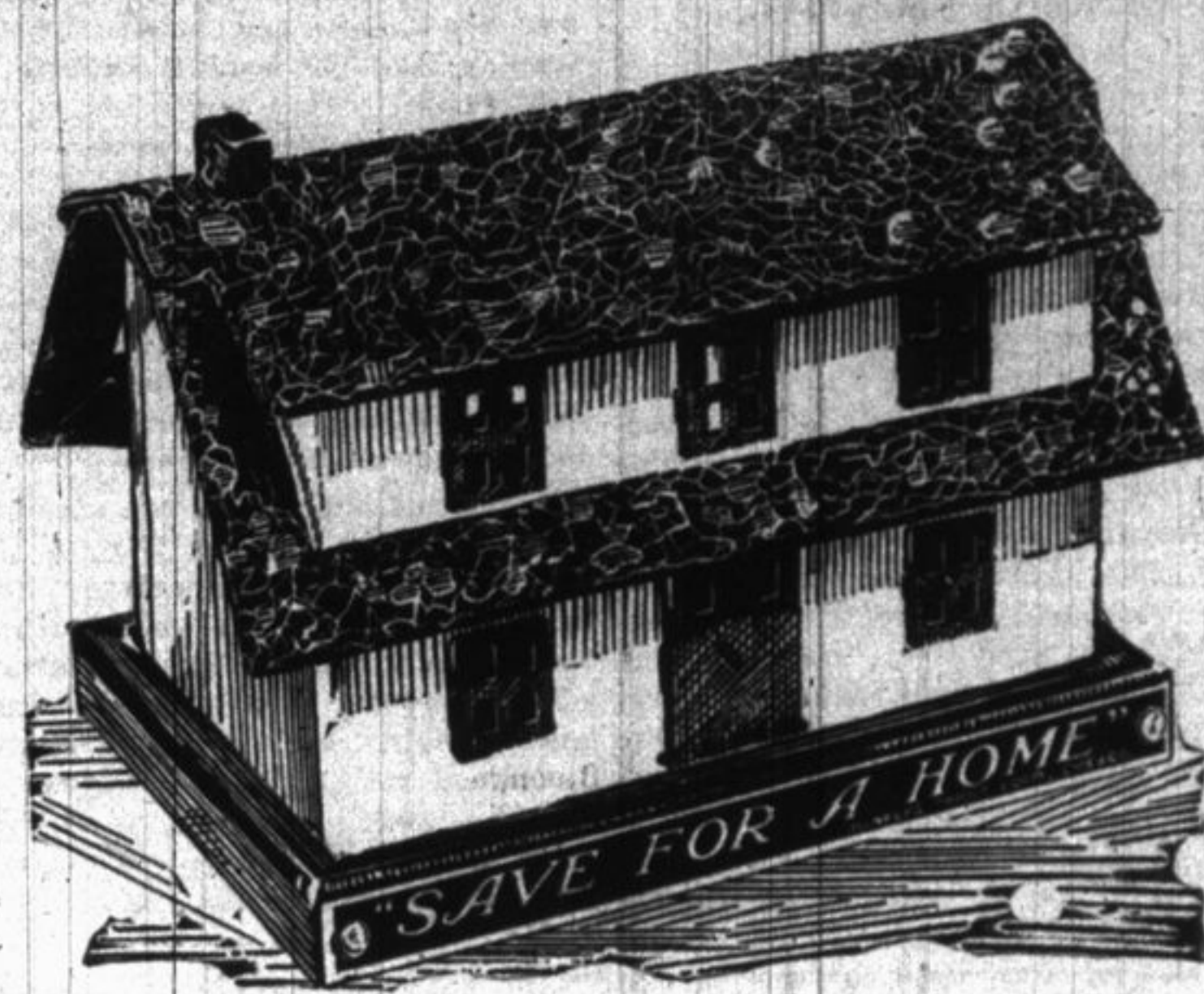
