



Notice is hereby given to all persons interested, that the bids for the furnishing of all labor, tools and materials necessary for the construction of a connected system of sanitary sewers in St. Johns Avenue, from Cedar Avenue south to Lot 25, South Highland Addition, were opened on the 1st day of June, A. 
