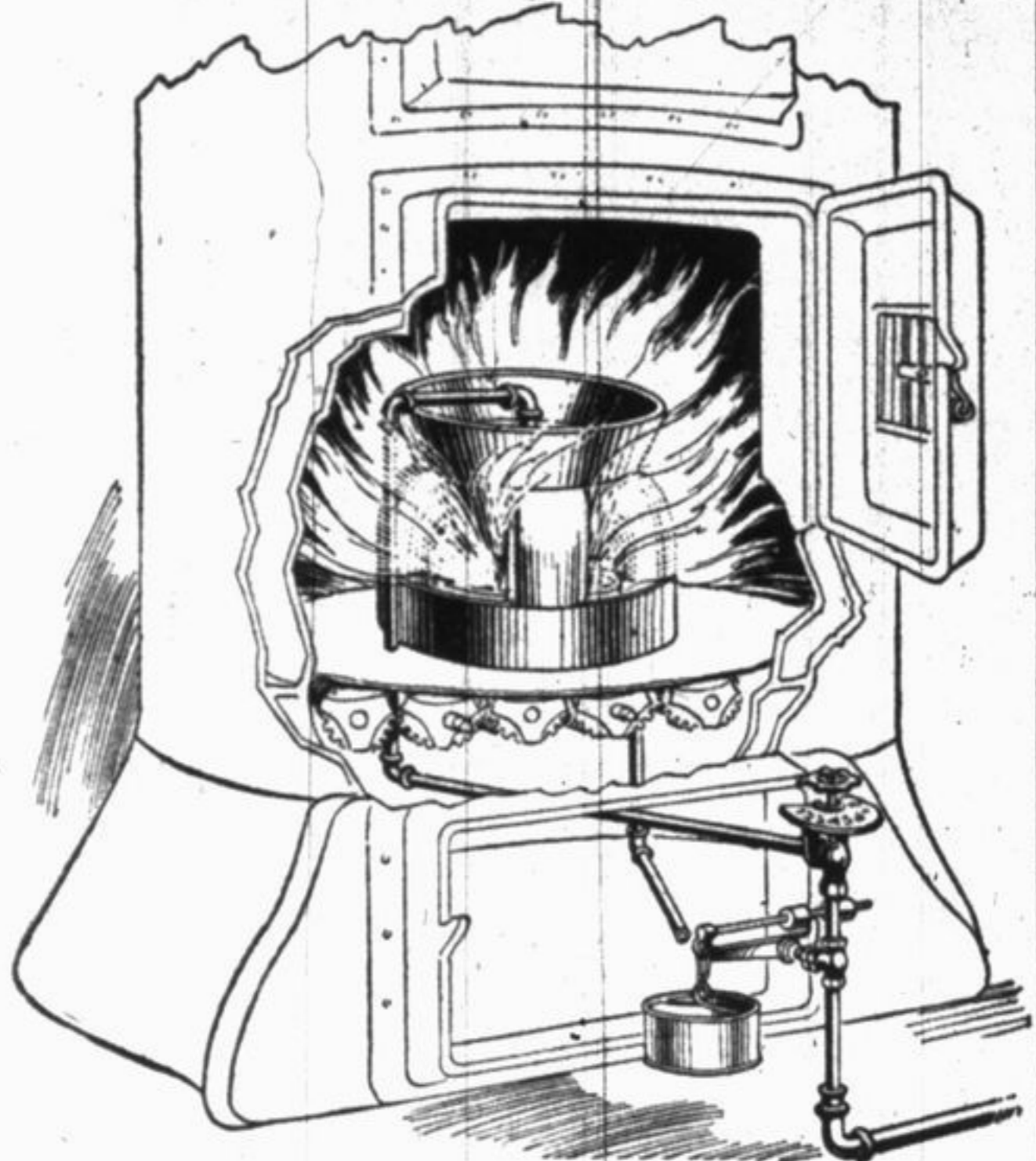

NOTICE OF AWARDED CONTRACT

Notice is hereby given to all persons interested, that the bids for the furnishing of all labor, tools and materials necessary for the construction of a connected system of sanitary sewers in St. Johns Avenue, from Cedar Avenue south to Lot 25, South Highland Addition, were opened on the 1st day of June, A. D. 1923, and Chas. M. Porter Co. being the lowest responsible bidder, the contract was awarded to said Chas. M. Porter Co. on the 8th day of June, A. D. 1923.

Said bid for the work is as follows:

646 lineal feet of eight (8) inch inside diameter, salt-glazed, vitrified, hub and spigot tile pipe sewer, laid at an average depth of thirteen (13) feet, including trenching or tunneling, backfilling and removal of all surplus excavated material, laid complete at Two Dollars Fifty Cents (\$2.50) per lineal foot \$ 1,615.00

680 lineal feet of ten (10) inch inside diameter, salt-glazed, vitrified, hub and spigot tile pipe sewer, laid at an average depth of eighteen (18) feet including trenching or tunneling, backfilling and removal of all surplus excavated material, laid complete at Three Dollars (\$3.00) per lineal foot \$ 2,040.00

170 lineal feet of ten (10) inch inside diameter, salt-glazed vitrified, hub and spigot tile pipe sewer, laid at an average depth of eight (8) feet, including trenching, backfilling and removal of all surplus excavated material, laid complete at Two Dollars (\$2.00) per lineal foot \$ 340.00

7 brick masonry manholes, three (3) feet inside diameter, average depth sixteen (16) feet, walls and bottom eight (8) inches thick, laid in Portland cement mortar composed by volume of one (1) part Portland cement and three (3) parts sand, mixed with sufficient water, with three-fourths (3/4) inch wrought iron ladder rounds, spaced six-sixteen (16) inches from center to center, from top to bottom of said manholes, with asphaltic coated cast iron manhole covers, each weighing four hundred eighty (480) pounds, average thickness of metal one and one-quarter (1 1/4) inches, diameter of lid of cover two (2) feet, including all excavation, backfilling and removal of all surplus material, constructed complete at One Hundred Seventy Dollars (\$170.00) each \$ 1,190.00

12 eight (8) inch junctions with six (6) inch hubs, constructed of vitrified salt-glazed tile pipe, hubs closed with vitrified disks, cemented in place, laid complete at Two Dollars (\$2.00) each \$ 24.00

13 ten (10) inch junctions with six (6) inch hubs, constructed of vitrified salt-glazed tile pipe, hubs closed with vitrified disks, cemented in place, laid complete at Two Dollars Twenty Five Cents (\$2.25) each \$ 29.25

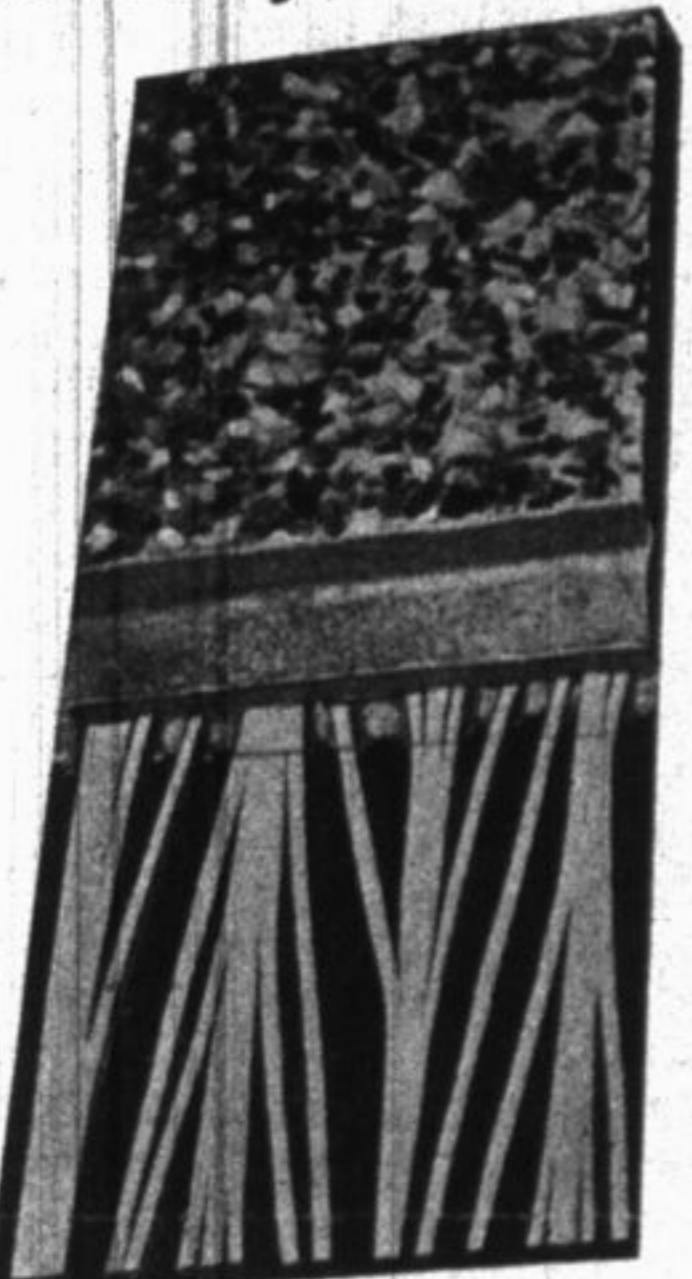
