HOSPITAL REPORT SHOWS ACTIVITY

Average Number of Patients In Last Three Months Was 46 Daily

The annual and quarterly general report of the Lake county general hospital committee submitted to the board of supervisors last week showed that the activities have greatly increased from month to month. Since Dr. Chas. Lieber took charge as superintendent, July 1, 749 patients have been admitted and the largest number in the hospital in any one day was 63. During this time 369 operations have been performed. There have been 75 births in the last ten months.

The average number of patients in the last quarter was 46, there being 21 births and 27 deaths, 54 major operations and 53 minor operations in the quarter.

The average monthly expense of the hospital in the last quarter was about \$1,800, including a monthly payroll of \$2,560. The report showed a balance of \$842.58 on hand June 1. The committee asked that they be permitted to purchase a new cook stove, make arrangements for male quarters for this fall, construct a roadway, buy a high pressure boiler, construct a sewage disposal plant there being much complaint from neighbors because of present unsanitary conditions at the present outlet, permission to purchase a laundry mangle, an auxiliary pump and tank, and fireproof windows and doors.

The committee reported that the money they had available for some of these needs had to be used in the equipment and finishing of the tuberculosis and contagion buildings which were not completed when the present committee took over the management of the institution.

FAMOUS REMBRANDT PRINT IN EXHIBIT

Visitors to the Print galleries of the Art Institute, now located on the first floor, to the left of the main entrance, may now see the famous hundred guilder print by Rembrandt, so-called because one of these prints was sold for one hundred guilders, about \$10,000. The title of this famous print is "Christ Preaching."

In the exhibition are rare and valuable etchings of landscapes, also by Rembrandt. They are all from the collection of Mr. John Wrenn of Chicago.

There is also on view fifteen of the choicest etchings by Anders Zorn, among which are the famous "Toast," and the vigorous portrait of Renan. These are from the Wallace L. DeWolf collection.

Bryan Lathrop's large collection of Whistler etchings and lithographs are also on exhibition, together with the interesting views of "Old Paris," etched by Meryon, which were the gift to the Art Institute of heirs to the Wrenn Estate.

ONE-MAN CAR USE MUCH INCREASED

Safety Cars More Generally in Use in Smaller Cities and More Economical

Use of safety or "one man" cars on electric railway is becoming more general in Illinois and other states. The safety cars are now being used quite generally in the smaller cities and even in Chicago they are used on lines in the more sparsely settled sections of the city. Safety cars are being operated on some interurban lines also.

The regulatory authorities in most states have approved the operation of safety cars. The Massachusetts Public Service Commission in ruling favorably on such operation said in part: "One-man cars have two distinct uses. They may be used merely to decrease expense, or they may be used to increase service and business without a corresponding increase in cost. On many short city lines where traffic is light, frequent service cannot be profitably maintained with ordinary equipment. Yet infrequent service means loss of business, for people will often walk farther than wait long for a car. By using one-man cars on such routes a twenty-minute headway can be changed to a ten-minute headway or a thirty-minute headway can be changed to a fifteen minute, with little additional expense and with a gain in service to the public in traffic to the company."

The commission also quoted the following comment from a work on "Electric Railway Transportation": "The dividing line between loss and profit in towns below 25,000 population, and on big city lines of weak or moderate traffic, is so thin that the change from two men to one man per car, producing lower platform cost or better headway at less expense, may convert loss into profit."

The importance of a system of reforestation is set forth in the 1922 year book of the U. S. Department of Agriculture in an article entitled "Timber: Mine or Crop?" The basic thought of the article is that we are mining our forest just as we are mining our minerals. In the case of our minerals, however, they cannot be reproduced, while our forests can be. Not only can they be, but they must be, or within a few years the United States will be face to face with a very serious famine of wood and wood pulp products.

We are the largest consumer of wood products in the world, using nearly two-fifths of all the wood consumed in the world. We have exhausted more than half of our original supply of timber and at the present rate we are consuming more than four times as much timber as the rate of timber growth. The necessity of beginning extensive reforestation now is evidenced by the fact that a timber crop requires approximately 30 years before the trees again attain maturity necessary to make them valuable.
