their drivers busy, because the wages of drivers are another big item overhead expense.

There are many instances like these. The cause is usually thoughtlessness. Many who expect impossible service do not stop to consider the situation. If they did, they would know that in this age of keen competion, high wages and heavy overhead, no business house can afford to follow the old-time methods. is no disposition to restrict service; in fact service is emphasized in every organization and every business, but it must be organized service and not the haphazard, desultory kind that was common a decade ago.

Old Order Changed The old order has changed in Highland Park, as well as elsewhere. This is a new age and a new city. Instead of a village of two or three thousand, Highland Park is a city between 7,000 and 8,000. This is 1923, and not 1913. Everywhere conditions are different. We often say that we live in a fast age. It is true in busias in other lines. The methods of 10 or 15 years ago were well enough then, but no business could survive upon such methods today.

Delivery of goods today is as prompt and efficient as ever in history. Keen competition and the use of of the motor truck makes it so, but the service is standardized and scheduled. Any housewife can get her needs supplied if she will be governed by the delivery schedule and get her order in at the proper time, and if she will see that all the articles she needs are listed in the order, she'll get them all at But if she overlooks one wants a second trip made-that will be difficult; special trips disorganize the delivery system, and upon organization only can a delivery system be maintained without too great over-

Memories of Past Age The old days of easy going merchandising are gone. In every line expenses of operation have doubled and trebled and only by organizing service can the merchant hope to make a profit.! Dobbin and the barefoot boy and the hitching weight are but memories of a past age in local merchandising. They never were rushed and usually had plenty of time to haul a spool of thread to any place, at any time. If a \$50 horse and an eight dollar boy killed a littl etime it made little difference in those old easy-going days. But when a \$1,000 truck and \$ \$30-a-week driver are required to double on their route, or have to wait an hour in front of the store it the merchant money, and lots it, in a month. In fact it can't be done, and those who expect that kind of service are living in the past. Those days are gone forever.

Delivery service in Highland Park is efficient upon organized lines and those who adapt themselves to existing conditions get excellent results.
