NEIGHBORHOOD JOTTINGS

Happenings of Interest About This Section of The North Shore; County Seat Doings

After years of lamp and gas light at Druce lake the first electric lights were installed there yesterday. This makes that vacation spot one of the most modern in Lake county.

That John Lach, 40 years old, Sixteenth street and Kristian avenue, North Chicago, committed suicide Sunday night while crazed with liquor was the verdict returned by the coroner's inquest presided over by Coroner J. L. Taylor.

Lieut. William J. Slattery of the U. S. S. California, flagship of the battle fleet, has been transferred to Great Lakes and is locating in Waukegan, having just arrived in this city. He is an aid for training at the Great Lakes Radio School.

Judge P. L. Persons last week continued until July 16 the hearing on the objection to taxes on the property of the Catholic school at Area. There have been several arguments in this matter. The representatives of the school claim the property should not be assessed for taxation because it is not run for the purpose of making money, being only a religious institution.

Mr. and Mrs. Harold H. Ambler of Lake Forest, last week were authorized by the court to adopt Roy Glickley, 10-weeks old son of Mr. and Mrs. Albert Glickley, 1747 East 67th street, Chicago. The petition upon which Judge P. L. Persons acted stated that the Amblers have cared for the infant practically since it was born.

The non-high school board of the county met last week at the office of T. Arthur Simpson, county superintendent of schools and allowed tuition to pupils in the non-high territory. The cost of sending pupils from this territory to high schools was \$54,000 for the year.

Plans are on foot at the Waukegan Elks club for a big water carnival to be held at the Waukegan bathing beach on August 14 when the Elks will celebrate the twenty-first birthday of the lodge with a monster blowout.

FORT SHERIDAN NINE IS SEEKING GAMES

Open For Dates With Baseball Teams in This Vicinity; Details Given

The Fort Sheridan baseball team, an amateur nine composed of soldiers of the post only, is looking for new worlds to conquer, or, in other words, wants games with other teams in this section. CANADA BUILDING MANY AUTOMOBILES

Industry Has Shown Big Expansion in Recent Years; Breaks Record

The automotive industry in Canada has shown constant expansion in recent years, which reflects to a considerable extent the activities of American manufacturers who have established subsidiary operating units in the Dominion, according to reports from Canadian sources.

The number of automobiles manufactured in Canada last year exceeded all previous records, reaching 101,007, or seven per cent more than the previous record output attained in 1920 and 53 per cent better than the 1921 turnout.

Total value of the output last year was \$81,956,429, or 14,906,220 greater than the preceding year, although \$19,509,417 lower than the 1920 production.

CARS RESUME STOP AT LAUREL AVENUE

Locals on North Shore Line May Again Be Boarded at That Point, As Formerly

The North Shore Line on Saturday, June 30, resumed the stopping of local cars at Laurel avenue, in this city, as requested in a resolution adopted by the city council June 8. A letter from the head offices of the road was received a few days previously by City Clerk Warren stating that the city's request would be complied with. Local cars formerly stopped at Laurel avenue, until about two years ago, when the stop was eliminated.
