MORE ROAD PAVING CONTRACTS READY

Another' letting of hard road paying construction, grading and bridge building is announced by the State Department of Public Works Buildings, Division of Highways. date of opening of bids will be gust 8th, at ten a. m. The work will consist of approximately 85 miles of paving, 75 miles of grading and 45 separate bridges.

With a grand total of 394.21 miles of paving completed in Illinois in 1923, the Division of Highway is rapidly approaching its goal of 50 miles per week, according to its latest report on progress made to Governor

During the week ending on tha date 40.79 miles of standard 18 foot concrete pavement was laid. largest week's run for a single shift in the period covered by the report is accredited to contractor W. Smith, Section 21, Route 25, whose crew laid 6,094 feet. Incidentally this broke the 1923 record for week's run. The H. K. Rhoades company is accredited with building th greatest mileage of pavement year, having laid 8.12 miles.

The report shows that there are now employed in road construction 9,100 men, 2,000 teams and 116 mixers, besides the humerous fleets of trucks and other motor equipment.


