

U. S. LEADS IN USE OF DOPE; IS MENACE

Amount Consumed in This Country Compared With Total In Other Lands

Dr. Bundesen, health commissioner of Chicago, gives the following most interesting figures on the use of dope in this country, showing as it does that the habit has been growing and that it is a real menace to the people right now:

"Italy uses one grain of opium per capita; Germany, two grains; England, three grains; France, four

grains, and the United States, thirty-six grains."

"The amount consumed in the United States annually is sufficient to paralyze the nation for one-twelfth of a year."

"The most pitiful part of it all is that over 50 per cent of the fiends are under 23 years of age."

"The use of drugs has doubled within the last two years. There are at least 1,000,000 addicts. One out of every 100 persons passed on the streets of our cities is a victim."

"What are we doing? We cannot treat a case at the Lawndale hospital unless the woman has been found with a social disease. Treatment is denied at the Bridewell unless the patient has been found guilty of a

misdemeanor. Men and women are today committing crimes to break in so that they may be saved."

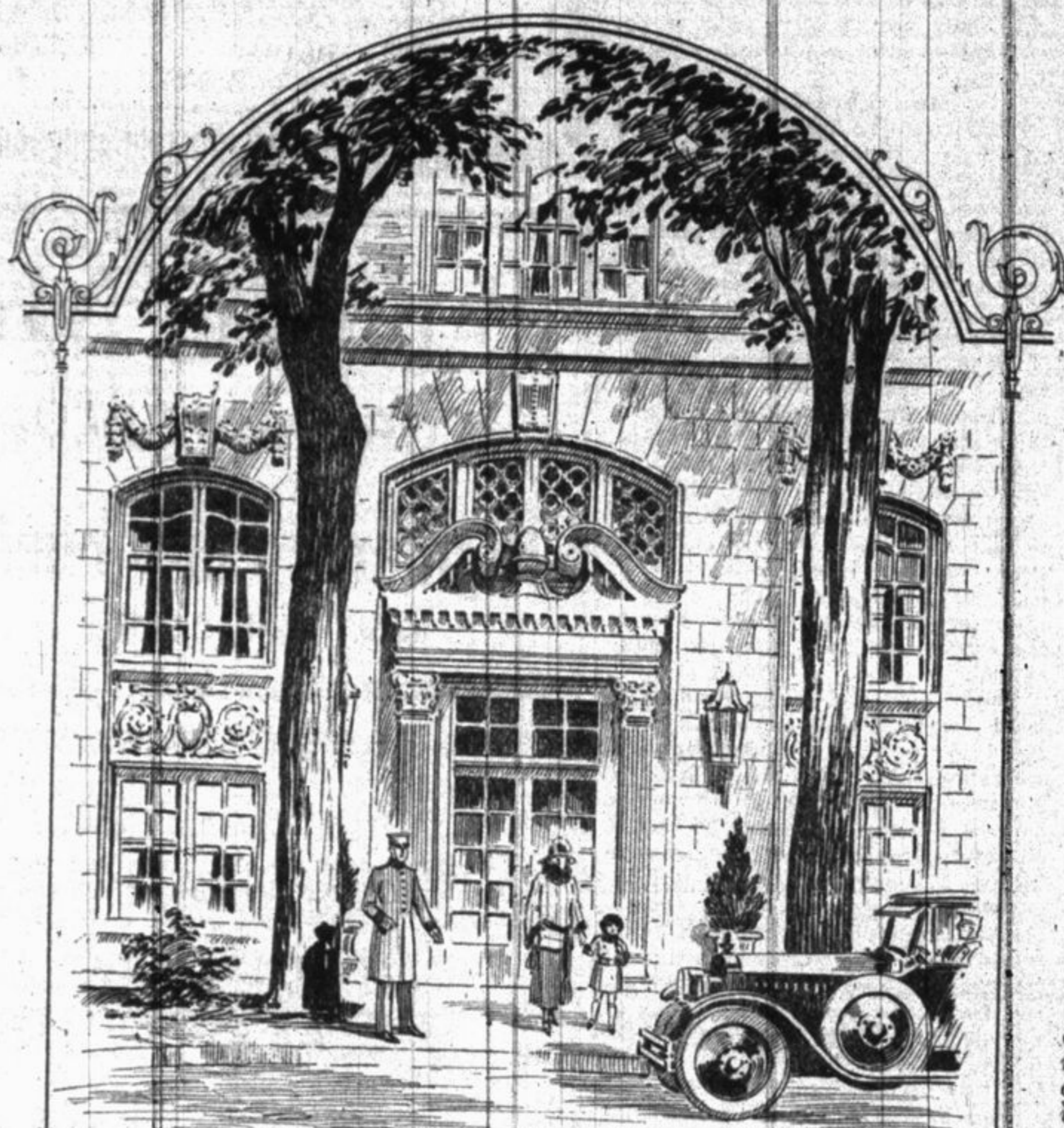
