## DEERFIELD DEFEATED BY PROVISO, 7 TO 3

HARD-FOUGHT GAME HERE

Teams Evenly Matched & Score  
Close as Result; Visitors  
Bring Band and Fans  
Waukegan Next

Fighting desperately and losing only in breaks, the Deerfield-Shields football team was defeated Saturday by Proviso, on the local field, in the close score of 7 to 3. The teams were so well matched that whichever side had the ball kept it, smashing through for gains again and again, until the opposition, as the goal line was neared, stiffened and held.

Proviso brought a big band with them and a bunch of rooters that filled the visitor section of the bleachers. Deerfield fought handicapped by the absence of two or three of its best players, but the sturdy resistance of the locals held the onslaught of the opposition again and again, despite all odds. Capt. Reichelt with a lame shoulder fought heroically with his team, despite his injury and his team mates backed him with the best they had. It was a clean game throughout and hard-fought on both sides, and there were few penalties.

For Deerfield Reichelt, Kyalla, McClure, Simmonds and Stipes played an excellent game; Dyer and Dever showed up well in the backfield.

Merritt of Proviso pulled down a long pass for their touchdown, and Follette and Myers of their team made a good showing.

Deerfield plays Waukegan next Saturday at Waukegan, and it is expected a large number of local rooters will accompany the team.

The Game

Proviso kicked off to the Deerfield 35 yard line. Proctor made seven yards through center. Dever went six more. Deerfield fumbled but McClure recovered. Proviso intercepted a forward pass on their own 40 yard line. Dreiske stopped one play but Proviso made first down on two bucks. An end run netted seven yards. Kyalla intercepted a pass and ran it back 30 yards. Mike, Dever and Proctor made 20 yards on four plays. Dyer went 15 around right end. He went five more through center. Joe failed to gain. Proviso recovered a fumble. Follett went six yards. Two more bucks made six more. On two successive plays Follett went 15 yards. Follett took play after play, after his fellow backfield men failed. Every time he went five or six yards. Kyalla, Stipes and Dever broke up plays so we got the ball on downs. Proctor failed to gain. Dever went eight. Joe again failed so Dyer kicked. Two bucks and an end run gained only six yards so Proviso punted. Dever went two and Mike went nine.

A buck gained four feet. Dever went 15 yards. Dever went four more. A pass was incomplete. Dyer went 15 yards around right end. A buck gained three yards. Joe Proctor completed a place kick.

Proviso kicked to our 20 yard line and Mike Dyer ran it back 20 yards. Dever and Dyer made first down. Proctor broke through for four yards. Another buck made first down. After a buck, an end run, and a pass were incomplete, Joe Proctor's place kick went wide. After three bucks Proviso punted.

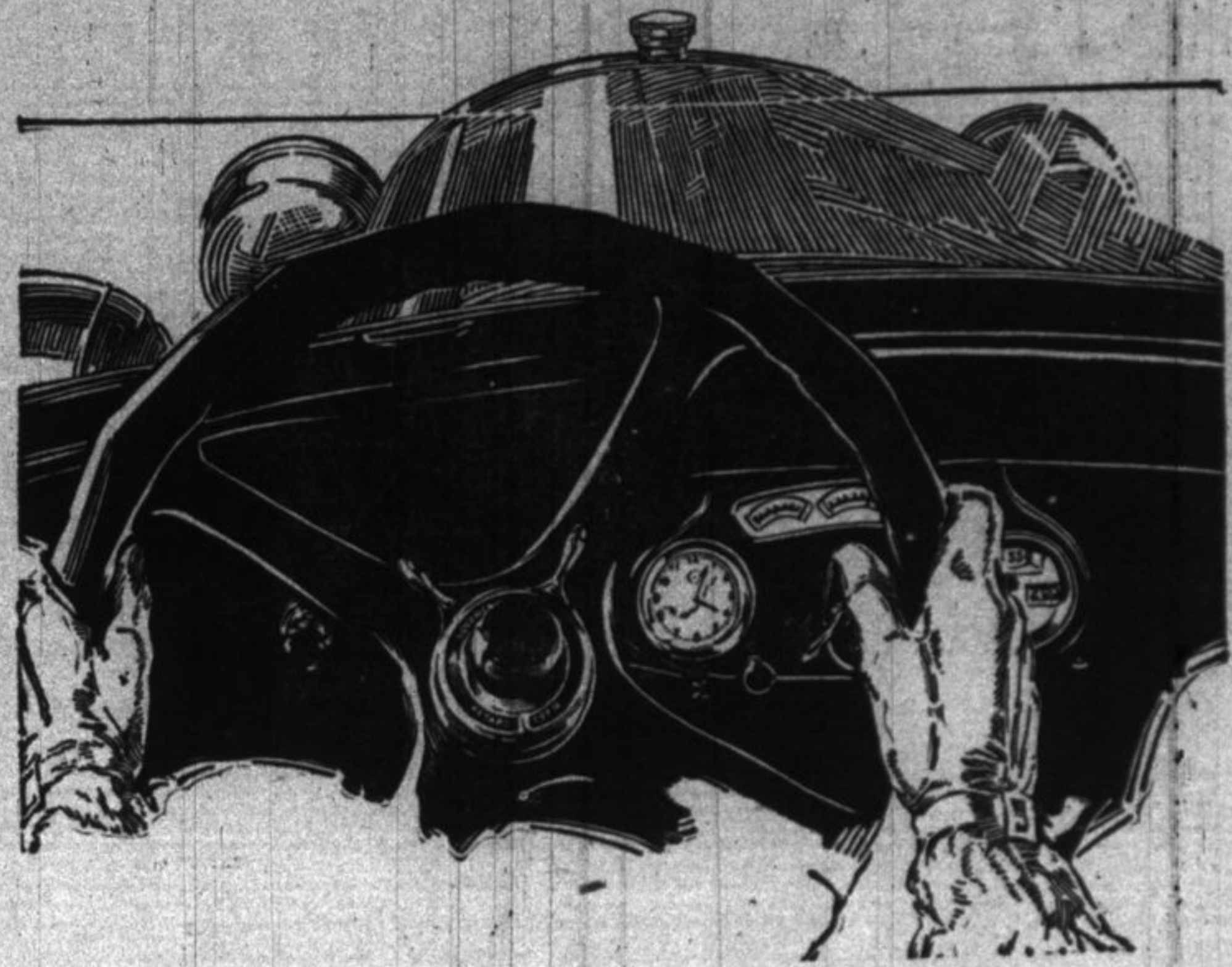
