29 YEARS AGO TODAY IN HIGHLAND PARK

"Member 'Way Back When' These Items Appeared in Local Newspaper?"

Wednesday, Nov. 20, 1894.

Fortunate indeed are those who have a cow for milk prices have again advanced, the local dealers are now charging 6 cents per quart and butter will no doubt go up to 28 cents per lb. before long.

The City Council voted down the granting of a franchise for the Waukegan Gas company to bring gas into our town and their point was well taken. The installation of gas for street lighting would not only involve a great expense, but our city is well lighted up at present with the oil lamps and for cooking purposes gas is quite dangerous.

John Mooney's team of oxen got stuck in the mud on Prospect avenue last Monday, while bringing a load of hickory wood to Judge Hibbard. There isn't much chance of getting the wagon out until spring and one has to drive around over Hazel avenue to get to the lake.

City Clerk John Finney, after returning from a two-day fishing trip along the DesPlaines river, was pleasantly surprised to find a telephone installed in the city hall. He reports a heavy fall of snow west of Deerfield.

ANCIENT METHODS OF COMMUNICATION

Most people regard the postal service as a modern institution; yet this is not so, for regular postal services have existed for more than two thousand years.

In those days letters were not written on paper. They took the form of short sticks, on which a message was inscribed either by means of paints, or by burning it on with a kind of primitive poker-work outfit. These letters were delivered by regular relays of postmen over thousands of miles of country.

Even the telegraph was in use in a crude form. Messages could be sent in an hour or two over distances of hundreds of miles by means of a system of shuttles, who passed them on from one to the other.
