LEADS COUNTRY IN BIBLE CLASS LIST

Iowa produces, not only the nation's largest crops of corn and oats, but the largest percentage of boy attendance at Bible classes among the states leading in boy members of the

No less than 96 per cent of the Iowa Y boys are represented in the enrollment of their Bible classes. Among other states California contributes 75 per cent, Ohio 54 per cent Pennsylvania 42 per cent and New York less than 40 per cent of boy membership to the Bible class. Iowa is sixteenth in population among the states in this compilation made for the Y. M. C. A. year book, but stands eighth among them in the membership of boys attending Bible class

and first in percentage. Interest in the Bible is growing in Ohio. That state has furnished the greatest number of boy members both of the Y and of its Bible classes in the last year. There are 11,948 in these classes and a total of 22,094 boys in the Y. M. C. A. of that state. Ohio is fourth in population, but she won first place from Pennsylvania in Y boy membership, though Pennsyl-
