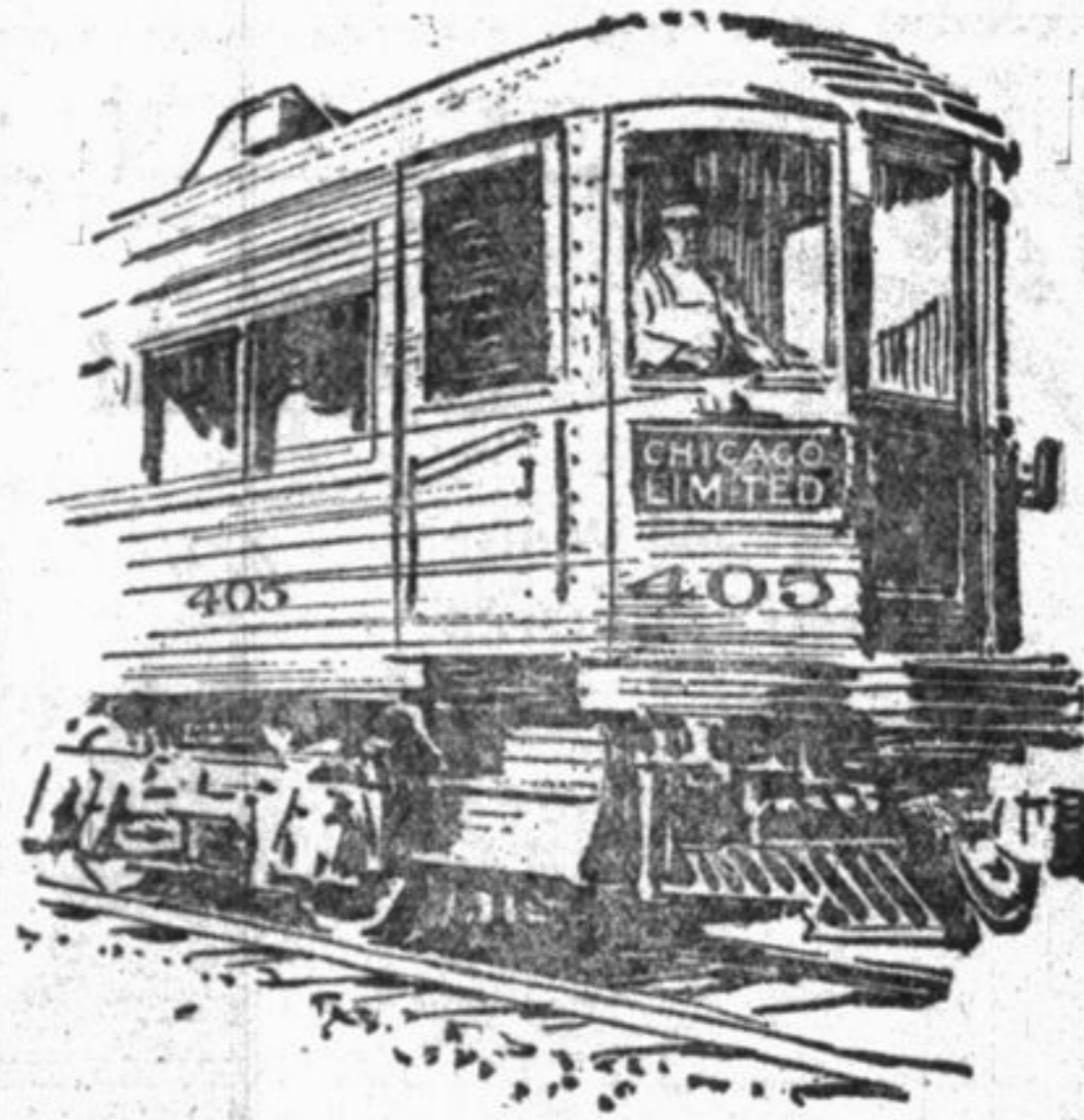

## STUDENTS TO TOUR EUROPE IN GROUP

VISIT COLLEGES THERE

First-Hand Study of Educational Institutions Planned for Party; Places to be On Itinerary

First-hand study of the educational institutions of the old world under the personal supervision of Prof. Elmer E. Jones, director of the school of education of Northwestern university, is to be undertaken the coming summer by a class of American students who will visit the principal cities of Europe. Some of the most famous educational experts of Europe have been communicated with by Prof. Jones and have agreed to lecture to the visiting students. This is an experiment, according to the leader of the movement, as no other university has made such an attempt in recent years, if ever.

**Travel Course of Study**  
"The travel course of study of European schools, colleges and universities will be open only to seniors or graduate students who have completed a B-course in Education," explained Prof. Jones. "We can handle a class of 100 Americans but may not have over fifty for the first trip. If the trial course is successful, as it certainly should be, another party of students may be taken over the following year. No exhaustive report as to the condition of European schools, or of their new work, has been made since the World war, and hence we feel we shall be making important discoveries."

Prof. Jones gained considerable fame when he investigated the educational centers of Europe," continued the board of education of the Methodist church a few years ago. He traveled over the perilous mountainous region of that Balkan state on mule-back.

**Visit Chief Centers**  
"We shall visit London, Brussels, Paris, Munich, Zurich, Rome and possibly one or two other great educational centers of Europe," continued Prof. Jones. "The tour starts from New York on or about June 20th and will continue practically all the summer vacation period. We expect many school teachers in our party and are planning lectures on shipboard, both going over and returning. Three hours credit in Education at Northwestern university will be given to each member of the party. Our first objective will be London where two weeks will be devoted to the study of English schools. In London the lectures to our travelling students will be at the University of London and Prof. Percy Nunn, professor of education of that institution, has agreed to plan the course for us. There will be at least thirty lectures in London and in the afternoons and over week-ends we shall visit points of interest, including the Shakespeare home. We hope to secure Oxford and Cambridge professors to assist in directing the English course."

**Louvain Included**  
"Our next stop will be in Brussels where Prof. De Croy, Belgium's noted psychologist, of the University of Louvain, will sponsor our investigation of Belgium's educational work. Paris will be our third stop and the national commissioner of education has written me an indorsement of the plan and has agreed to arrange the lecture program for France. Our fourth stop will be at Munich where the famous Dr. Kerschsteiner, who has lectured extensively in America, has given us assurance of full co-operation. He will provide speakers for us upon the educational work throughout Bavaria."

"At Zurich at the university of that name we shall study Switzerland's school under equally able direction, and after a week there, we plan journeying to Rome where Miss Campanella, an assistant superintendent of Roman schools, a young woman who speaks English fluently and is making a name in educational circles, is to organize our course. We probably shall sail for home from Naples late in August."

**International Problems**  
Prof. Jones pointed out that the American mind is turning more and more to international problems and that American school teachers are constantly showing greater interest in European educational matters. His unique plan for a travelling school in Europe has been presented to the faculty and authorities of Northwestern university and has received hearty indorsement.

### USE CAUTION WHEN OILING CONE CLUTCH

Do Not Let Oil Come in Contact With Leather Facing; Causes Slips

Use caution when lubricating a cone clutch so as not to permit the oil to come in contact with the leather facing. This will produce a slipping clutch. The oil should be applied to the ball thrust bearing and the clutch yoke.

The leather should, however, be treated occasionally with neatfoot oil to keep the leather flexible. If the clutch slips, from too much oil on the leather, it may be overcome by dusting fuller's earth over the surface.—Illinois Motorist.
