the name of Highland Park "Ravinia. He explained that he was not making it a suggestion but simply brought it up for the members and people of the city to think about. He pointed out that there are several Highland Parks which cause mail confusion, while Ravinia is a name known internationally because of the famous summer opera, and besides no North Shore community is more distinguished by ravines than is Highland Park.

Supervisor William J. Obee spoke at length on his view of the proposed annexation of Deerfield township territory, which he does not favor. He gave figures similar to those printed last week in the Press over his signature.
