NEW BANK OPENING IS NOTABLE EVENT

(Continued from page 1) banking service obtainable anywhere. "This is your bank and we are your willing servants," said President Appel.

It was a notable expression of public interest in a great community asset such as this bank has become, and the day will long be remembered by all who attended the opening. The crowd came early. At 8:30 in the morning long lines of waiting people stood at the doors eager to inspect the new building, and from then all through the day and evening the bank was crowded with visitors, all delighted with the spaciousness and handsome equipment of every department, and the opinion generally expressed was that here was a bank that the city can point to with pride as one of its show places, a bank unequalled in size and completeness of equipment in cities three times the size of Highland Park.

Beautiful Interior
The interior finish is in Italian marble in two shades, that harmonize perfectly in their warmth of coloring with the mahogany furniture and handsome bronze grill work of the cages. The lobby is an exceptionally commodious one, with all facilities for patrons, and the commercial and savings departments are arranged along the west and east sides, respectively, with ten windows opening to the lobby, so that all possible business may be handled expeditiously and without causing patrons unnecessary delay.

The offices of President Appel and Charles F. Grant, vice-president and cashier, are on the west side of the entrance, with the commercial department, and that of Harry Paul, vice-president, on the east side, with the savings department. Ranging north from these are the sections occupied by the other members of the bank staff, all equipped with every necessary modern facility. In the rear of the commercial department is a separate room for the computing machines and on the opposite side is a commodious cloak room and a telephone switchboard. Lighting fixtures, waiting rooms for patrons, both men and women, lavatories and other facilities are the best obtainable, and the finish in every instance is handsome and down-to-date in every particular. An employees' entrance on the St. Johns avenue side is an added convenience.

Below the first floor is the great steel and concrete vault with its massive steel door, and in the vault is accommodation for 4,000 safety deposit boxes with plenty of space for safe keeping of all valuables. A trusted employe is always in charge here to serve patrons.

Besides this vault for money and valuables belonging to the bank and its patrons, there is another equally strong vault, the old bank vault, which is used for the keeping of the bank's books and records when not in use. This gives access to the books at all times without opening the main vault.

The directors room on this floor is richly finished and furnished in mahogany and is in keeping with the general ensemble of the splendid banking house of which all Highland Park is justly proud.

On Saturday's opening day the bank received large floral pieces from several sister banks, including the First National Bank of Chicago, the Continental Commercial Bank, the Union Trust company and the Broadway National bank of Chicago.

(Continued from page 1) love and veneration as to the other greatest men of the past who are like mountain peaks in the history of our country. Outstanding, they will see two great peaks; Lincoln, the idealist with a prophetic vision of peace and happiness in his own country, and Wilson, the idealist whose like vision compassed the whole world.

It took years before Lincoln was universally loved and respected. The animosities of weak, selfish men were given time to die out like a noxious fever or a fire. History is impersonal, and we must always wait for history to give us the true dimensions of these great mountains of mankind that occur along the path of the world's progress. The Lincoln lesson has been accepted by enlightened people and it is the great lesson today that is saving today wherever it is being understood.

The idealism of Wilson is for the whole world. Ignorance and selfishness are fighting it, but it will prevail in the end and save civilization. It will take years and often we will be discouraged when brute force and political intrigue appear uppermost in the titanic battle that democracy is waging for the right to live in peace. These years seem long to us as we live them, but history when it looks back to write, will say that the victory was won in an incredibly short time. It has taken the world 2000 years to begin to accept and live the idealism and altruism of the Nazarene. But who can say that the world is not growing better? We know that Christ will eventually win the world and make it happy. And Lincoln and Wilson were, after all only great men who each in his time applied the idealism and altruism of the Nazarene to the practical problems of his day.

"To make the world safe for democracy" was the immortal utterance of a great and sincere man. It has been made the football of politicians and demagogues, but after these scoffers are forgotten it will live throughout the world as have lived the words of Lincoln—a "government of the people, by the people, and for the people shall not perish from the earth."
