MILK PRODUCERS OF COUNTY IN ELECTION

Officers Are Chosen at Meeting at Libertyville Last Week; Many Members

Gordon Ray, of Diamond Lake, was elected president of the Lake County Milk Producers' association in a meeting at Libertyville at which more than 300 members were present. T. J. Stahl, of Waukegan, was named vice-president and W. I. Woodin, of Area, was elected secretary-treasurer.

On the board of directors were Judge Thomas Peden, Chicago; Charles Sibley, of Antioch; F. A. Wilton, of Antioch; and Ed. Umbdenstock, of Prairie View.

The resolutions committee was Judge Paden, T. J. Stahl, Robert Small, of Waukegan; John Wertz, of Ivanhoe, and Fred Grabbe, of Waukegan.

There are now more than 2,000 members in the organization. When the dream of the milk producers is realized there will be a 100 per cent membership in the county and this will be in a very short time according to one of the officers.

That the milk producers of the county have taken an interest in such an organization is seen through the fact that 22 delegates will be sent to the annual convention of producers that will be held in Chicago early in February. With these delegates will be one from McHenry county, Kenosha county, and even districts in Northern Indiana.
